**MacLean Leads Island MP's In Speeches In Parliament**

OTTAWA (Special) As he begins a cabinet minister Hon. Angus MacLean topped Prince Edward Island's federal representatives in the number of times he spoke in the Commons at the last session of Parliament. Fisheries Minister MacLean was on his feet 49 times to speak about 31 different subjects and make one full-length speech. Ex-university professor Heath Macquarrie was next in the table according to the Hansard index, official record of the House of Commons debates. He spoke 17 times which is very high for a government member whose opportunities for speaking are necessarily more limited than those of opposition Liberal or CCF members. Macquarrie covered 12 different subjects and made three full-length speeches. John A. MacDonald was next with nine entries on different subjects speaking nine times but four of them full-length speeches. Dr. Orville Phillips from Prince was the softest-spoken of the four. He spoke eight times on

**Red China Brews Surprises In Science And Technology**

NEW YORK (AP)—Red China is brewing up some of the next surprises in science and technology. For most of its 10 years, the Chinese people's republic has stressed education and science as mainstays of new highly advertised "great leap forward." One goal was creating a new army of scientists and technologists. "Now they are beginning to reap the fruits—and in five years or so we can expect some razzle-dazzle in science," says a prominent American physicist. He asked not to be identified, since he has continuing contacts with Russians and Chinese at international scientific meetings. He recently observed some of the Chinese students studying in Russia. "Even the Russians are flab-

bergasted about their energy and utter devotion," he reports. "The Chinese students will study until 2 a.m., then be up at 7 a.m., taking callisthenics before starting another long day. It seemed to me even the Russians feel a little uncomfortable even though they themselves are accustomed to hard work. "One Soviet scientist remarked 'We understand you Americans,

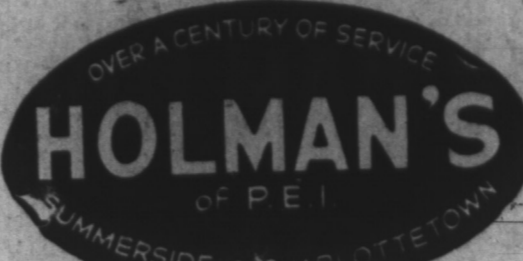

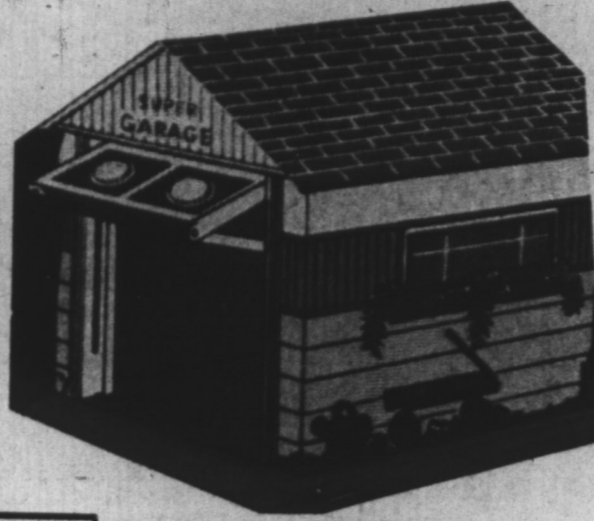
