## N.Y. Stock Market Makes Its 2nd. Straight Weekly Clim

**NEW YORK (CP)**—The stock market, buoyed again by the federal reserve board's easier policy, closed at a new high of 316.00 straight weekly rise last week.

The Associated Press average of 30 stocks rose \$1.10 to \$156.30. It was by no means a consistent, unimpaired rise. In fact, the first two market sessions were pretty dismal. Stocks declined sharply on an assortment of bad news about business and the economy.
