A general discussion took place regarding the installation of buzzers in the homes of the firemen so that they might have immediate warning of a fire. It was pointed out that when the fire alarm was sounded, the Main Street became crowded with the cars of those heading for the fire impeding to a great extent the quick passage of the fire truck, and in general impeding the work of the firemen. It was felt that even a few minutes earlier notice to the firemen would permit them to get the equipment to the fire before the street became congested with cars and people.
