# Giant Centennial Rally Attended By 17 Schools

 Montague was the scene of one of the biggest elementary school rallies ever held here when students from 17 schools and their teachers met yesterday for the Confederation Centennial rally. Led by the fire truck under the direction of Fire Chief Colwell and followed by Montague's Fire Department float, two students, Nancy and Scott Beck dressed in costumes of 1864 led a parade of over 600 through the streets of Montague, all waving flags and carrying banners of their schools. The auditorium at Montague Regional High School was filled to capacity when all of the students had filed in. Rev. A. G. J. Steeves was master of ceremonies and introduced the speakers. The first speaker, William Beadin, gave an address on the history of the Island with emphasis on the conditions that led to confederation. This was followed by a presentation of a Centennial medal and a copy of Dr. Currier's story of the Charlottetown Conference in 1864, to each pupil. Three awards were presented to winners in the provincial Centennial writing competition. Second prize was won by Lynda Lou MacLeod, Montague, fourth prize by Alinda Carpenter also of Montague, and honorable mention was received by Elaine Curry of New Perth.

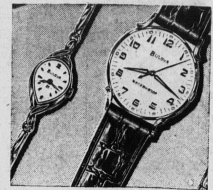
