

New Steamship Company.

A New Steamship Company has been formed at North Sydney with a capital of \$50,000, to establish steam communication between Sydney and Boston through the Bras d'Or Lakes and St. Peter's canal, calling at Baddeck and other points on the lakes, Port Hawkesbury and Halifax each way. Two first-class passengers and cargo twin-propeller boats will be built on the Clyde this winter, and will be put on the route early next season. They will be of a suitable length to pass through the canal and have accommodation for one hundred first-class and one hundred intermediate passengers and 700 tons of cargo, besides bunkers and will steam at least thirteen knots loaded. One of these boats will leave Sydney on every Friday morning during the navigable season, and arrive in Halifax Saturday morning, and Boston Monday. The other will leave Boston Saturday, arriving at Halifax Monday, and North Sydney Tuesday. They will be timed so as always to make the run through the lakes in the day time. In the winter season they will be employed between the West Indies and ports north of Hatteras in the sugar and passenger trade.

Building Towns and yet Poor.

It is curious how often the men who are capable of the greatest enterprise fall short of achieving financial success. Mr. Grainger, who rebuilt Newcastle and earned for himself the sobriquet of the Northern Haussmann, was financially as unfortunate as from an architectural point of view he was successful. And now a similar case is reported from Birmingham, where Mr. Alfred Humpage has failed, with liabilities, estimated at £130,000. After building a large central arcade with suites of offices, a large colonnade in New-Street which is one of the architectural features of the town, and a Birmingham Lincoln's Inn, he has collapsed. The extent of his assets is not yet ascertained, but they are expected to exceed the liabilities. The failure is reported to have been caused by Mr. Humpage's liabilities under the covenants of mortgages of property which he owns outside the centre of the town, and which he has been called upon to meet—*Pall Mall Gazette*.

The "Princess Louise" Disaster.

Regarding the loss of the "Princess Louise," at Digby Gut, Captain Scott, R. N. reports:—"Seeing that the barometer had been falling since noon, and that Captain Guilford had a valuable charge upon his hands, it was a grave error in judgment not to attempt to carry the ship into a place of safety before nightfall. When the "Princess Louise" left Cumberland Basin she ought to have been better prepared for the voyage; her bow anchors should have been shackled on board and all her sails bent to be used in case of necessity. It is now impossible to ascertain why these things were omitted. When the hawser parted it was impossible for the Newfoundland to afford any assistance to the "Princess Louise," as it was as much as she could do to save herself, but had the sails been bent in the new ship they both could have proceeded on their voyage with the wind abaft the beam."

The Colored Man His own Benefactor.

The *Brooklyn Eagle* says, the real benefactor must be a negro himself. As soon as the American of African descent has put forward representatives of his own race who can hold their own against white men in the departments of life, intellectually, morally and socially, he will find his equality recognized. Till then he will not, because there will have been no evidence of its existence. He will not win it by legislation which is based upon folly and which seeks to give him privileges that are still denied in some parts of the country to white foreigners.

The Milwaukee millers are getting down to some nice points in the economies of their business, as is so generally the practice nowadays in all industries. They have resolved hereafter to use only ten-hoop instead of twelve-hoop barrels. Some of the millers have been using only ten hoops for months, but on December 4 the Millers Association passed a resolution that all would hereafter use only ten-hoop barrels—after the present supply of barrels was used up—on all their patents and other flour. It is said that in this way they will effect a saving of three cents a barrel, or enough to pay the cartage on wheat and the subsequently cartage on the flour.

The old project of a railway between Vaudreuil and Ottawa, which, as our readers will remember, was an alternative proposition to the Northern Colonization Railway when the latter was projected, is being revived, and application will be made under the coming session of Parliament for a charter authorizing its construction. The railway would be of great advantage to the counties of Vaudreuil, Prescott and Russell, opening up an important section of country, and would compete with the Canadian Pacific and the Canada Atlantic for a share of western traffic.
