more and give direction to and form a basis for unit areas. It was pointed out by Dr. Dewar that the problem of consolidation is separate from the high school program but would be more easily dealt with once larger units of local administration are formed. The minister said the larger units will deal chiefly with matters of uniform assessment, and provide more equal educational opportunities through the unit area.

Dr. Dewar said that consolidation would involve the amalgamation of several small local districts by mutual consent to form a more efficient graded elementary school.

Attending yesterday's meeting were the chairmen and members of all regional high school boards: Harold Landry, administrator of regional high schools; Wilson Ross, regional high schools superintendent, and Maurice Cahill, administrative officer.

Also discussed at the meeting was the matter of a teachers' salary scale and it was indicated that this should be further discussed by the school boards.

It was announced that a provincial association of regional high school boards has been formed and the association will hold its first annual meeting on Nov. 7 at Central Queens Ave.

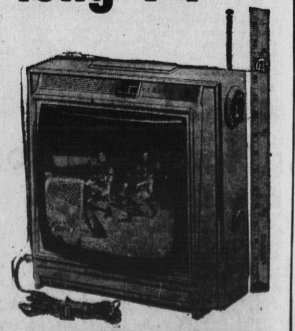
