Unpreparedness Said 'Simply Shattering'

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada is in a state of unpreparedness that is "simply shattering," Conservative defence critic Gordon Churchill said here.

Eight months after the Liberal government promised action on getting nuclear warheads, there still are none for the Bomarc anti-aircraft missile or for the RCAF's division in Europe.

Secondary Industry Needs Discussed By N.S. Board

BY WALTER HAYES - TRURO (CP)—Problems facing secondary manufacturing industry in Nova Scotia, especially high freight rates and competition from outside the province, came in for close scrutiny here Friday and a start was made toward finding solutions.

About 150 representatives of the province's secondary manufacturing industry, government officials and the newly-formed Nova Scotia Voluntary Planning Board put their heads to-

gether in the fifth of a series of economic planning conferences.

The conferences, began about a year ago under the direction of the Nova Scotia government, are designed to help industry by keeping it informed and seeking solutions to problems.

After a day of discussions, a number of committees composed of industry members were set up to continue the study. G. I. Smith, Nova Scotia's finance and economics minister, stressed that the government's part was to help and co-ordinate but most of the work was up to industry itself.

CITIZEN PROBLEMS - Lloyd R. Shaw of Halifax, vice-president of L. E. Shaw, a brick manufacturer, said the main problem facing the chem-

ical and mineral industries in the province are smallness of size, dependence on the construction industry for markets and limited markets outside the province.

Smallness of the industries—averaging about 20 employees a plant—made it difficult to take advantage of mechanization, large-scale production and departmental specialization.

Speaking during a panel discussion, Mr. Shaw said dependence on the construction industry for markets and limited markets "mitigates against the efficient and profitable use of plant equipment and capital since the volume of activity tends to fluctuate widely from year to year."

Efforts to develop and expand outside markets were hampered by the bulk weight of many products, growing restrictions being placed on other provincial governments on pro-

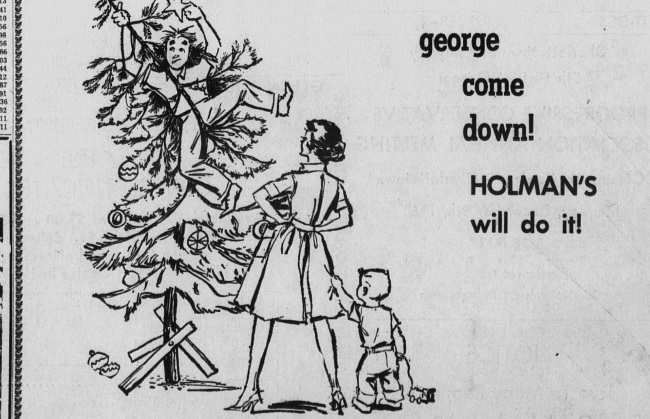
