The funeral arrangements had not been completed at the time of writing.

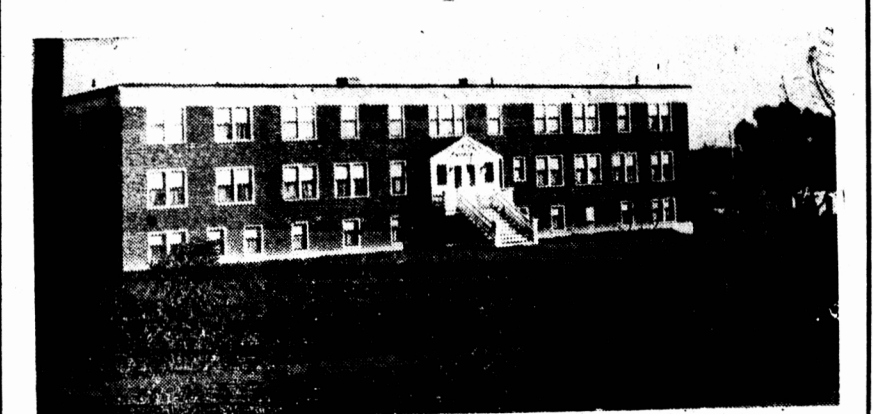

River be made commissioner for taking affidavits in the Supreme Court for King's County. The motion was granted.

Grand Jury Report

The following is the text of the Grand Jury's report: "To His Lordship, Chief Justice Thane A. Campbell, judge presiding at the November Assizes for King's County, Prince Edward Island:

"We, the Grand Jurors, wish to report as follows: We note with satisfaction that many repairs have been effected in this building. The jail is in good condition, clean and sufficiently furnished. The courtroom and in fact the whole building shows proper and in fact excellent care on the part of the jailer.

"It has been reported to us that the chimney in the jail section is not functioning properly. When the wind is in a certain quarter the room fills with smoke, and this could be remedied by installing a baffle top on the chimney.

"It has also been reported that as the jailer must be absent on necessary errands, there is nobody except prisoners in the building, and in case of a fire breaking out and the prisoners being all locked up, the results might be tragic. We recommend that an assistant be appointed, probably part time.

"We note also that the ceiling in the juryroom is in bad shape, and in danger of falling. We recommend that it be replaced. We further recommend that the hallway leading to the clerk's office be furnished with a suitable covering, and in fact the courtroom floor should also be covered."

Signed, Andrew S. MacDonald, for self and fellow jurors.

The court was adjourned to meet at 11:00 a.m. today, when the civil jury case of Violet Reynolds versus William Miller will come before the court.
