

### Oyster Culture And Disease Is Subject Of Rotary Talk

"A peak of 15 million oysters for the market, with the population of Canada approximately the same, provided one oyster for every man, woman and child in 1915", Dr. Reid Logie, director of the federal biological station, Ellerslie, said in addressing the luncheon meeting of Rotary at the Charlottetown Hotel yesterday.

Dr. Logie was speaking of oyster culture and the prevalence of disease in the various proven oyster areas of the Maritime Provinces. Touching on the food value of oysters, he said they rated between milk and fish in concentrating certain sea elements of medicinal value. Their greatest demand was by those who take pleasure in eating them.

"Oysters, lobsters and clams were a good source of revenue to those who are living in a marginal group, and their culture plays a significant part in the financial life of such people," Dr. Logie said.

**ORIGIN OF DISEASE**  
Tracing the origin of the oyster disease to the beds in Malpeque Bay in 1915, Dr. Logie described the spread of the disease throughout the major areas of the Island, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

"By 1955 recovery in the Malpeque area was definite, but whether due to experiments or as a result of immunity developed by the surviving oysters, no decision has been reached.

"When we think of the millions of oysters in the P.E.I. areas, the survival of one per cent, which has been established as possible, we can still look forward to a continued and expanding oyster harvest, by slow but definite steps," under the vigorous investigation started in 1930", he said.

Dr. Logie described the transfer of "spat" from the Malpeque area to depleted areas in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick during the past 10 years.

Three million oysters were transferred and the experiment is being continued on a mass scale.

"It is not known just how valuable these young disease resisting oyster are, but judging by the tests started in 1957, the resistance is going to be good and crop indications for 1959-60 are pleasing" Dr. Logie said.

**"FEELING WAY"**  
"We are feeling our way as we go along and if our experiments are successful, the Island will be in a premier position for transferring to depleted areas".

## Canadian Institutes' Members Plan For International Meeting

OTTAWA (CP) — Several husbands and a 13-year-old girl will go along with Canada's 90 delegates to a conference of the Associated Country Women of the World in Edinburgh this summer.

Mrs. J. W. Adams of Eibehon, Sask., tour director for the Federated Women's Institutes of Canada said Monday some Canadians will tour the British Isles before the Aug. 3-16 conference. A group of about 15 delegates plan to visit Brussels, Paris and Copenhagen after the conference.

Youngest member of the group will be Jane Steeves of Surrey, N.B., who now is 12 but will have her birthday before she leaves for Scotland. She will act as a messenger during conference sessions.

She is the daughter of Mrs. Leonard Steeves, a member of a federation sub-committee which ended a three-day meeting here Monday.

**DISCUSS PARTICIPATION**  
With president Mrs. Keith Rand of Port Williams, N.S., the five-member sub-committee — the federation's planning body — has discussed Canadian participation in the international conference and made plans for the federation's biennial meeting in Charlottetown July 6-14.

Mrs. Rand said the Senator Cairine Wilson citizenship award will be made for the first time this year. The winner will be announced at Charlottetown.

This year's project is an essay on how to teach a child to be a better world citizen.

Federation officials, holding their first meeting in the national office set up last October, said the 95,000 member organization now has nearly \$12,500 in a voluntary-donation foundation fund set up four years ago to support the Ottawa headquarters.

Rural women's groups also have contributed \$5,500 to a Ceylon flood relief fund established last year.
