

# Aircraft Carrier Living Not Bad Despite Failings

HALIFAX (CP)—Living conditions are hot and crowded aboard the aircraft carrier Ronaventure, but it's a long way from "unmitigated hell," Commodore J.C. O'Brien said here.

He was commenting on remarks in the Commons March 25 by Harold Winch, New Democrat party member for Vancouver, B.C., who visited the ship with a parliamentary group of Puerto Rico.

Mr. Winch said some sailors on the carrier lived in "unmitigated hell" and there was extreme overcrowding. He said the destroyer escort Annapolis was the opposite; it was too cold.

"Sure it's hot, it's always been a hot ship in the tropics," Commodore O'Brien told a press conference on the carrier's return from the 2½-month exercise in the Caribbean.

Twelve Canadian surface ships and two submarines on loan from the Royal Navy took part. He described the exercise as a complete success carried out under perfect weather conditions. Two incidents interrupted the schedule, the crash of an RCAF Argus which killed all 16 men aboard, and the search for a fishing boat.

Morale aboard the Canadian ships was high, Commodore O'Brien said.

"You know this when everything goes off as well as it did in this exercise."

"And it is crowded. We have 1,350 officers and men on board. We've modernized the ship a great deal—it is 20 years old—and we expect more improvements in the half-life refit that will start next year.

"The air conditioning always gives trouble on a big cruiser like this."

He said the temperature aboard the Annapolis was generally kept at 68 degrees, "cer-

## Destination Of 4-Year-Old Is Uncertain

SEATTLE (AP)—Seattle police are still undecided about the eventual destination of a four-year-old Canadian boy found abandoned last week in a downtown department store.

Police said the boy's mother, Carrie Lucille Boullier, was located Wednesday in San Diego, Calif., after a U.S. immigration service officer recognized the boy's picture in a newspaper.

The immigration officer remembered the woman accompanying the boy told him she was going to San Diego to be married and gave an address there.

Police said the woman, questioned in San Diego, said she would either send the boy to her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Bernard Boutlier of Mushaboom, N.S., or return to Seattle to take him with her.

She identified the child as William Anthony Martinson, Jr., Policewoman Jean Selvidge said the mother was to tell San Diego authorities her final plans for the boy.

Kay Twobig, captain of policewomen, said no charges would be brought against the mother if she can get assurance the child will be returned to relatives.

The boy, known until Wednesday only as Billy, was found in the store Friday. In his pocket was a note saying:

"I'm sick and can't care for him for a while. But I will come back for him."

## CONTRACT BRIDGE

North dealer.

North-South vulnerable with a part score of 40.

**NORTH**

♠ Q942

♥ A Q 8 8 3

The bidding:

North East South West

1 ♠ 3 ♠ 3 ♠ Dble

Opening lead — three of diamonds.

Here is an interesting hand where South made three spades doubled. You may not agree with the three spade bid, which was obviously risky, but South was largely influenced by the part score of 40 which he and his partner had.

If you examine all four hands, it would seem that South should go down one, since he apparently has two spades, two diamonds and a club to lose. But South made the contract, and the way the cards were divided, the defense could not do a thing to prevent it.
