## Jobless Fund Starts Plunge

OTTAWA (CP) — The unemployment insurance fund has started its downward plunge to threatened bankruptcy falling by \$27,300,000 to \$71,800,000 at the end of January.

The January dip in the fund's reserve followed the downward trend of a year earlier, thus reinforcing predictions a month ago that the fund will be bankrupt sometime in March or April.

The unemployment insurance commission paid out \$88,559,395 in regular and seasonal benefits in January. In the same month, total revenue going into the fund—chiefly from contributions from employers, employees and the government—amounted to \$61,259,654.

The difference — \$27,321,261—came from the fund's reserve, which held some \$99,000,000 at the end of 1962. If the drain on the fund continues at the pace set in the early winter months of last year, the fund is expected to hold only \$2,300,000 by the end of March, then drop into red ink early in April.

## GIRL IN FIVE THOUSAND

OTTAWA (CP) — When an Nicaraguan and Honduran go to name ambassadors to Canada?

It's been over two years since External Affairs Minister Green announced that Canada had agreed to establish diplomatic relations with Nicaragua, Honduras, Panama and Costa Rica.

Two months later, in March 1961, Mr. Green announced that Jean-Louis Desjardis had been named Canadian ambassador to the four, with residence in San Jose, Costa Rica.

Ottawa is still waiting for Nicaraguan and Honduran to nominate ambassadors to Canada, officials said Wednesday.

Costa Rica nominated its ambassador last June, but he has yet to come here and present his credentials. He is Gonzalo J. Facho, who is also Costa Rica ambassador in Washington and normally resides there.

ONLY ONE MADE VISIT  
Of the four countries, only Panama has selected an envoy who actually completed the diplomatic process by coming here and handing over his credentials to Governor-General Vanier. He is Augusto Guillermo

Arango, also accredited to Washington.

Another Central American ambassador who has yet to put in an appearance here, informants said, is Dr. Francisco R. Lima of El Salvador. He was nominated during the beginning of last year.

Dr. Lima too is accredited to Washington. It is a practice among the smaller Latin American countries to name their ambassadors in the American capital to serve concurrently as envoys to Canada.

Similarly, Canada makes wide use of double and multiple accreditation in arranging its diplomatic representation in Latin America.

Mr. Desjardis, Quebec City native and veteran of 21 years in the external affairs department, now is accredited to El Salvador in addition to Nicaragua, Honduras, Costa Rica and Panama.

From San Jose, he visits the other four capitals. Officials here do not appear greatly disturbed at Central America's apparent lack of interest in Canada.
