Lufthansa airliner burns in Rio de Janeiro. There were 29 passengers and a crew of 10 aboard. Airline officials said there were only three known survivors—co-pilot, while trying to make a land-steward and stewardess—which

would make toll of dead and missing total 36. Lufthansa's announcement in Cologne, Germany, identified the pilot as Capt. Wren McMains, 48, of Stamford, Conn., and a native of Lebanon, Ind. McMains was apparently killed. Plane came from Europe and Africa, and was slated to go to Buenos Aires and Santiago.

Chairman Of Parole Board Appeals For Understanding

OTTAWA (CP)—The chairman of the new National Parole Board, Thomas George Street, Tuesday made a plea for greater public understanding of the purpose of the parole board.

Mr. Street said he hopes the public will understand that the parole board will be trying to put prisoners back into society and that the public "will try to help these people."
Mr. Street said he intends to visit all eight federal penitentiaries as soon as possible.
BOARD MEMBERS
Board member Edouard Dion, 48, former Crown attorney of New Carlisle, Que., showed up with his left ankle in a cast. He broke it last Friday, just before leaving his Gaspé home for Ottawa.
The board will not officially come into operation until Feb. 1, but Mr. Street said he has come to Ottawa to stay. Other members are J. Alex Edmison, 55, Kingston, Ont., and Frank Miller, 47-year-old assistant director of the remission service the parole board will replace.
Mr. Street was asked whether he believes some change might be needed in the present system of putting prisoners paroled from federal penitentiaries under supervision of various welfare agencies' social workers or provincial probation officers.
OWN SUPERVISORS
While not in a position to state government policy, Mr. Street said he personally would like to see the board have some parole supervisors of its own.
At another point he indicated he would favor federal supervisors working in conjunction with the existing arrangement.
Mr. Miller, whose work with the remission service has brought him in close contact with such problems, said "in the whole correction field, there is a need for more trained people."

Gov't. Unlikely To Have Diesel Issue Re-opened

OTTAWA (CP) — The federal government will not join in reopening the CPR diesel firemen issue that has produced two rail strikes in two years, it was reported Tuesday.
Informants said Labor Minister Starr will set up a conciliation board to deal with the current contract dispute between the CPR and the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Engineers (GLC), but the diesel issue will be excluded from the board's consideration.
The government was represented as regarding the diesel fight as closed following settlement of a three-day strike last May, despite renewed efforts of the union to reopen it.
The board, expected to be set up in the next few days, will deal with other points in dispute, mainly a demand by the firemen for an 18-per-cent pay boost.
CENTRE OF SCRAP
The diesel scrap has centred around the CPR's plans to eliminate firemen gradually from freight and yard diesel locomotives. The firemen first went on strike for nine days in January, 1957.
Later, a federal royal commission found that firemen were not needed on freight and yard diesels.
The strike of last May ensued, followed by a settlement in which the union signed a "memorandum of understanding" accepting the principle that firemen are not necessary on the types of engines involved. It stipulated that no more firemen would be hired for freight and yard diesels.
The company agreed to keep on all firemen hired before 1956, with firemen being gradually eliminated as they retired, died

Canadians Get Out Of Cuba

OTTAWA (CP) — All Canadians who wanted to get out of Cuba have presumably left that country, the external affairs department said Monday.
About 57 Canadians asked to be evacuated when a general strike in Cuba affected hotel services. Nearly all of them were tourists.
There are about 300 other Canadians permanently resident in Cuba. They made no move to leave the island country, where Fidel Castro led a successful revolt.
