HALIFAX, Sept. 17. The case of the David J. Adams was continued to-day.

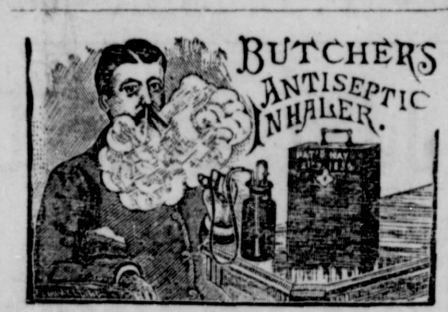
