

Trust Credit Union Plans School Project

SOUTH RUSTICO — Plans for expansion, better office facilities, loan counselling service, school credit union and silver jubilee celebrations were the highlights of a directors' report presented by Cyril Gallant, president of the St. Augustin's Credit Union Limited, South Rustico.

The treasurer's report submitted by Ronald Doucette showed an increase in assets of approximately \$5,000 over the previous year. According to the reports of the supervisory committee, credit committee and loan committee presented by Peter R. Gallant, Amy Piacou and Edmond Gallant, respectively, a similar credit union had a very busy year. Fifty-five loans, exceeding a total of \$25,000 were granted to members for productive and provident purposes.

The feasibility and desirability of a closer affiliation with the North Rustico and Good Hope Credit Union were discussed at the meeting. The board of directors were authorized to investigate the possibility of a joint subscription with the members of the Stella Maris Credit Union which in 1959, also reached the milestone of a quarter century of credit union service.

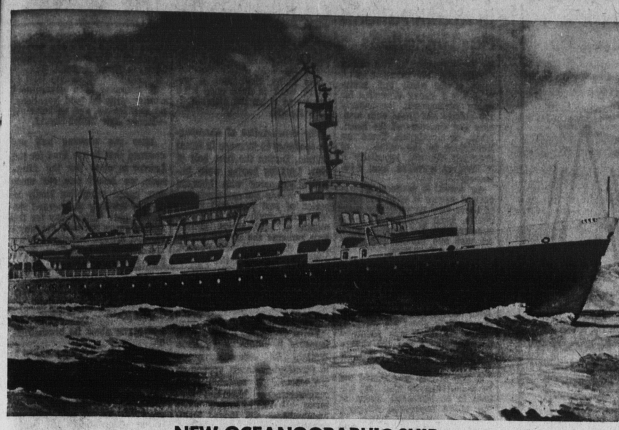

SUMMERSIDE — Miss Anne I. Ward, general secretary of the United Church Women, will be guest speaker at a meeting of the newly-formed United Church Women which has re-organized the work of several former church groups in one organization.

This meeting in Charlottetown will take place on Tuesday evening at 8 p.m. Miss Ward became secretary of the newly formed board of directors in January of this year. A native of London, Ont., and graduate in arts from the University of Western Ontario, she holds an ATCM degree from the Toronto Conservatory of Music.

In 1930 Miss Ward graduated from the United Church Training School and was designated as a missionary, going to West China under the Woman's Missionary Society.

During her term of service she became head of the fine arts department of the west China University. She returned to Canada in 1951 when all missionaries were evacuated from China.

After a year's touring Miss Ward was appointed general secretary of the Woman's Missionary Society, a position which she held until formation of the Ontario branch.
