Limewood Farm Shorthorns Qualify With Good Records

Several cows in the Limewood Farm herd of Sterling Wood, Mt. Herbert have qualified with good production records in the record of performance tests for Dual Purpose Shorthorns.

Limewood, Jessie Wave, a grand champion at Charlottetown last August, produced 11,253 milk at six years age, 446 butter fat for breed class average of 146 percent in milk, 145 butterfat. Her first four years' production amounts to 39,721 milk, 1,538 fat.

Limewood Kathie Duchesne produced 10,556 milk, 476 fat for BCAs of 147 and 165 as a six-year-old cow.

Limewood Daisy K. Gwynne produced 10,225 milk, 1116 fat for BCAs of 142 milk, 138 fat at five years of age.

Limewood Pauline Wave produced 9,477 milk, 376 fat for BCAs of 165 and 162 as a two-year-old. Limewood Nadine Minosa produced 6,899 milk, 386 fat for BCAs of 138 and 145 as a three-year-old and two seven-year-old cows in the same herd qualified with considerably better than the average for the breed class across the country.

Famous Victim Of Big Robbery Dies At Age 82

VANCOUVER (CP)—Andrew Herbert Mitchell, the victim of Canada's biggest train robbery, will be buried here Friday. He died Tuesday at the age of 82.

He was the bank messenger who was robbed of \$100,000 in gold bullion aboard a Canadian Pacific Railway train by a three-man holdup gang headed by Billy Miner in September, 1964.

The bandits commanded the train just west of Mission, B.C. in the Fraser Valley, unburied cars over a mile stretch of track and forced Mitchell to open the safe.

Miner and his gang were later captured and sentenced to the penitentiary but escaped. Miner, known in the Old West as the "Robin Hood of the Rockies" because of his boast that his loot all went to the poor, was later recaptured in the United States, still holding up train.

Mitchell left his job with Dominion Express as a result of the robbery and started a plumbing business in Vancouver.

The shy blonde grade 8 student made a one-line acceptance speech when she was presented with a \$50 cheque from the Canadian Lumbermen's Association and a copy of a portrait of Governor-General and Mme. Vanier by the National Gallery.

She was born in Kirkland Lake, Ont., but moved to Cape Breton as an infant with her parents. Mr. and Mrs. Donald Macdonnell and now is the oldest of eight children in the family.

Her winning poster, which depicted yellow and red flames burning a forest and bore the words "Waste Not, Want Not, conveyed 'almost naive immediacy' which 'gets the message across,' said Charles Comfort, director of the National Gallery and chairman of the board of judges for the contest.

NOT DEFENSIVE
