Freight Contract Loss On Newfoundland Route

The Blue Peter Line, operating the freight service between the city and Newfoundland, made 18 trips last year according to an answer filed by the Hon. Eugene Cullen, Minister of Industry, in reply to a question asked in the Legislature by Mr. R. R. Bell, Leader of the Opposition.

The answer also showed that the Province suffered a loss of \$29,965 under its freight contract last year with the losses varying each trip and three of the voyages showing a surplus. Hon. Mr. Cullen said that no new contract has been entered into with the same line. The Provincial company operating the service paid \$3,465 in wages. The Minister said in his reply that the figures quoted were not final as they are currently under negotiation.

At Montague The Government intends to build either a bridge or a causeway at Montague this year. Hon. Dougald MacKinnon, Minister of Public Works and Highways, said yesterday in reply to a question by Maj. John A. MacDonald, Third King's. The question asked was "is it the intention of the Government to build a bridge or causeway at Montague this year?"

Hon. W. E. Darby in acting as sponsor of an amendment to the County Court Act explained that it was a matter of changing the dates of the sittings in Prince and Queens Counties to permit of holding them at a time other than in the heat of the summer. Kings County is not affected by the change.

Teachers Check-Off Introduction of an amendment to the Act Incorporating the P.E.I. Teachers Federation started relations by both Premier Jones and Hon. Dougald MacKinnon regarding a "check off" of dues from teachers for the Federation. Hon. Mr. MacKinnon did not believe in the principle at all.

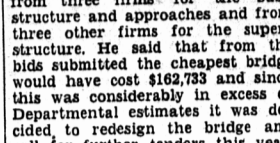
Premier Jones opposed this principle as he considered it "forcing people to practically join a union. It was made a part of the 1945 Act, he said, and though teachers might withdraw from the Federation they had to remain in it for a year. In answer to a question he said he had many complaints from teachers about the check off because in their first year of teaching they needed all the money they could get.

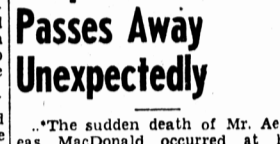
