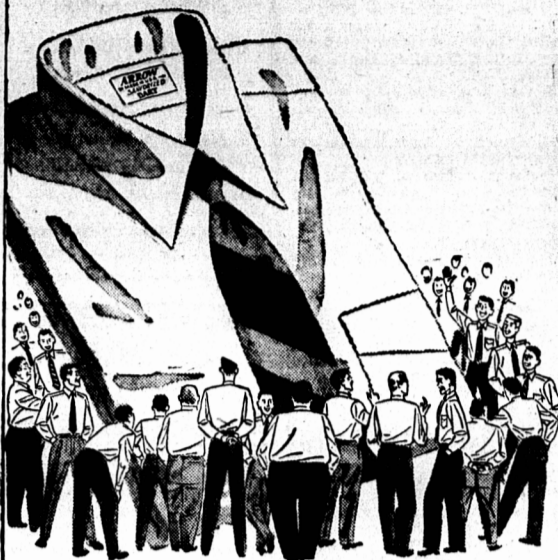

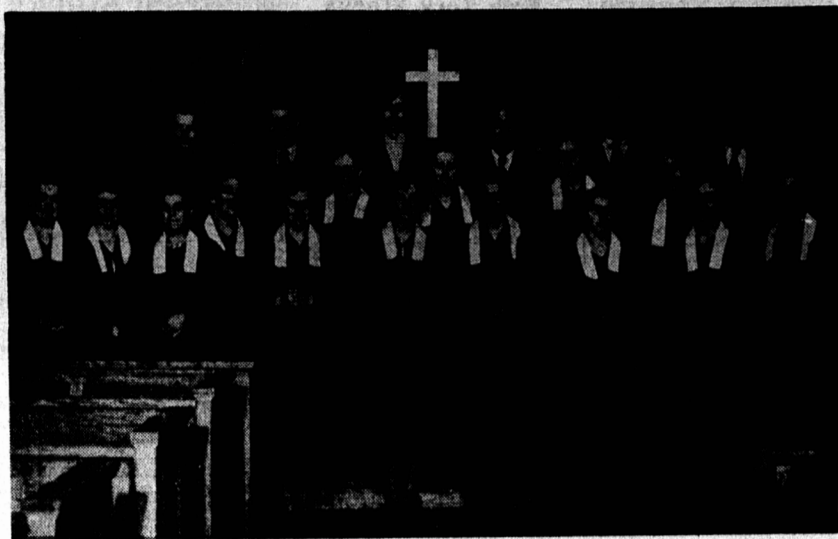

## Summerfield C.W.L. Annual Meeting

—Mrs. Joseph Croken was re-elected president of the Summerfield sub-division of the Catholic Women's League held in the church vestry Sunday afternoon, May 4.  
Rev. Eugene Murray opened the meeting by repeating the League prayer and the president presided and the roll call was answered by 12 members paying their annual fees.  
Business proceeded with the reading of the minutes of the last annual meeting and the previous monthly meeting which were approved as read.  
An annual financial statement was given by the treasurer, Mrs. A. C. Hughes, showing \$255.03 raised during the year and \$237.68 disbursed, leaving a balance on hand amounting to \$17.35.

Rev. Eugene Murray in his remarks voiced appreciation for the cooperation of all members of the sub-division and expressed the hope that this loyalty would continue throughout the coming year.  
He also stressed the advantages of a film projector and Mrs. Austin Murphy was appointed to take up the matter with the National Film Board.
