Much credit is due the Canadian Legion Branch No. 9 Kensington, who is sponsoring the Boy Scout movement here. And much credit is due Scoutmaster W. L. Miller and assistant Scoutmaster Ken Brammer, who has put much time and effort into the movement with the boys. At present there is twenty two boys registered Scouts. The Kensington Troop was formed in April 1952, and a patrol of eight boys were sent to Camp Buchanan Provincial Camp in July, and they brought home the honor patrol flag for the camp, which spoke well for the boys, and also their training received from their leaders in such a short period. They presented the Provincial Boy Scout Association with the names of five first class Scouts, and the committee from headquarters who interviewed the boys, passed the five boys eligible to attend the Second Canadian Jamboree at Ottawa, July 18 to 26, which again speaks well for the training these boys received in such a short period. The three patrols are very active.

Canadian Jamboree Leaders Named

R. A. MacGregor, of New Glasgow, Provincial Scout Commissioner for Nova Scotia and active in Scouting since 1911, has been named Camp Chief of the Second Canadian Jamboree at Connaught Camp, near Ottawa, next July 18 to 26. Assisting Mr. MacGregor as Cub Chiefs will be: Fred Finlay, Toronto; C. H. P. Killick, Winnipeg; Eli Boyaner, Saint John, N. B.; and Rees Hugh of Camrose, Alberta. Three thousand boys from all ten provinces will attend, as well as some from the United States.

Gallantry Award For Scoutmaster

For his bravery in rescuing Edward Nykforak 14, of Roblin, Manitoba, from drowning in Goose Lake last winter, Scoutmaster Dick Greenland, 26, also of Roblin, has been awarded the Gilt Cross by Canada's Chief Scout, The Right Honourable Vincent Massey, C. H., Governor General. The boy was skating about 70 feet from shore when he broke through thin ice and was in the water 15 minutes before the rescue was completed.

Scout Archives Enriched

The archives of Canadian Boy Scout Headquarters, Ottawa, have been enriched by a copy of Volume 1, No. 1, of "The Scout", the British Scout magazine which was founded by Baden-Powell. The gift came from T. W. Foster of Edmonton, Alberta, a Rover Leader and former District Commissioner. Dated April 18th, 1908, the edition contains 24 pages and the first article is "How I Started Scouting" by General Baden-Powell.

PARTIAL TO ELMS

About now, Mrs. Baltimore Oriole is searching for a suitable locality in which to set up house-keeping. A big elm would be best—a tree with a long branch starting from high up and hanging down to end in a fork of twigs at least 15 feet from the ground. An ideal situation would be beside a country road, or one running through some small town. A good shopping district within easy reach is essential, where plenty of caterpillars, beetles, ants, wasps, and later on grasshoppers may be had; and if this can be supplemented by a little fruit so much the better.

Above all, material with which to build a home must be accessible: plant fibres and down, bark, and possibly some milk weed stalks. One reason for preferring a spot not too far from human dwellings is so that hairs may be found, and better still, pieces of string and even bits of bright coloured wool from somebody's darning bag, but no dark material. First Mrs. Oriole attaches long fibres to the drooping twigs; then with her sharp awl-like bill she weaves the strands into a hanging pocket. She seems to sew, as she

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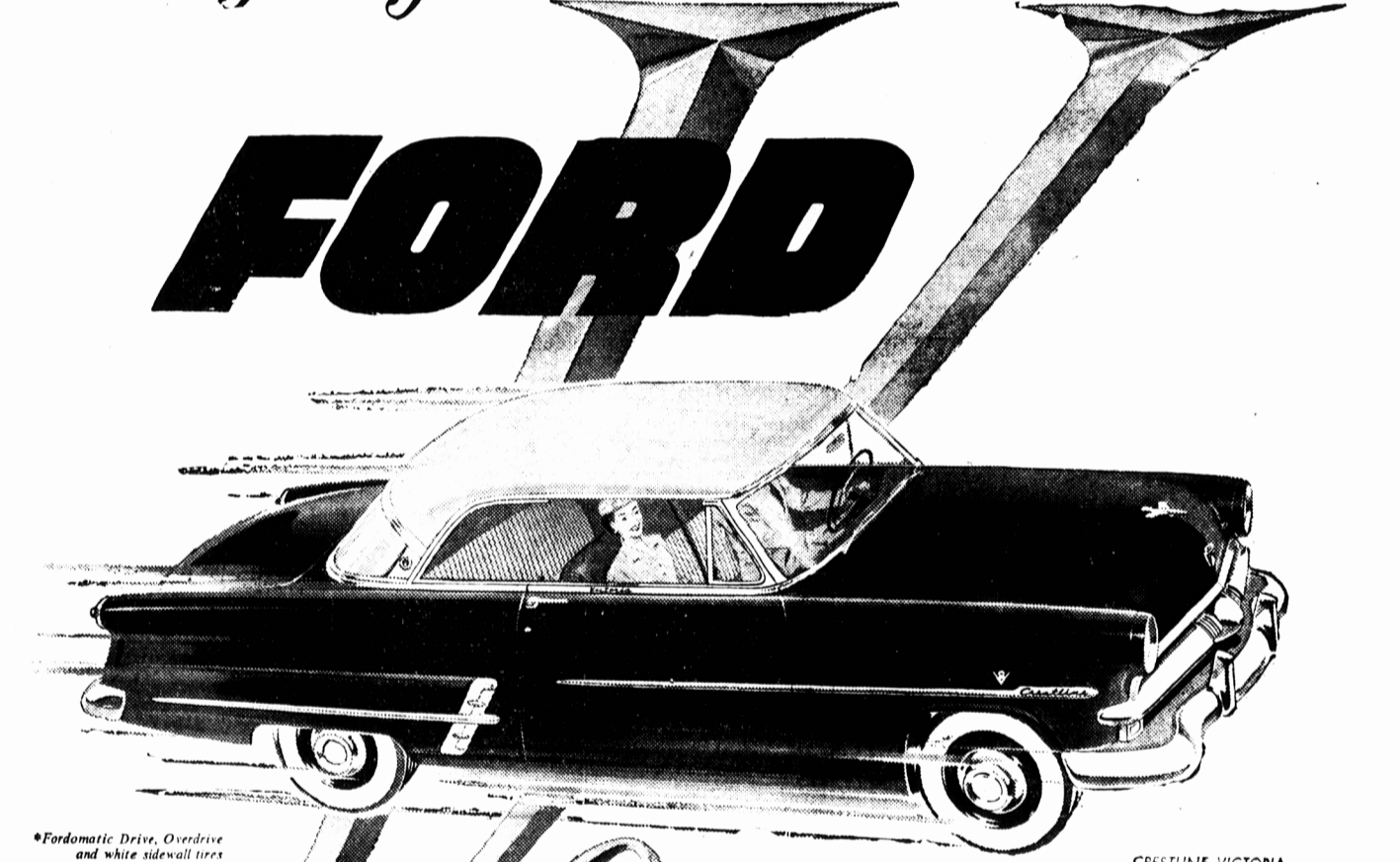
