SALISBURY MAKES ANOTHER SPEECH

And Devotes Himself to Home Affairs.

THINKS ALL FOREIGN QUESTIONS SHOULD BE DISCUSSED

By a Competent Committee, Who Could Assist the Minister.

(SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.)

LONDON, Dec. 17.—The Marquis of Salisbury, at a banquet given last evening in his honor, devoted his speech to home affairs and to general principles for the conduct of the foreign policy, without any direct reference to any particular question. Dwelling upon the necessity for discussion Lord Salisbury said it would be a relief if he could discuss and explain certain matters that had been and were being grotesquely misrepresented; but this he could not do without betraying his duty. The Government, he continued, should be judged, not on individual items, but on the success of a policy as a whole. If a minister goes to war on a trivial matter, he may find himself without the support of the people. This should be considered when people asked why we have not pushed to the point of war some secondary difficulty. Before condemning us for not going to war they should be sure there are no other complications in view, compelling us to recognize the force at the Government's disposal. I have often felt the want of such an institution as the United States Foreign Relations Committee. It is impossible here; but it must be a great advantage for a minister to be able to meet persons of his own political opinion and to explain to them reasons for his actions.

THE MILK IN THE COCOANUT

Secret of Germany's Leaning Toward Great Britain.

LONDON, Dec. 15.—The Vienna correspondent of the Times says: "In Austrian commercial and financial circles it is believed that Germany's leaning towards England and the United States is due to other than political considerations. The strain imposed upon the Berlin money market by the forced development of the German trade is beginning to tell severely on German finance. For the satisfaction of seizing new markets terms have been granted which the German industrial enterprise is ill able to afford. The abnormal condition has produced a situation which renders it advisable that the sympathies of English and American money markets should not be estranged."
