THE REAL YOU

For two columns I have been in pursuit of that most elusive of substances, or entities, or things—be it real you, or your personality, or what I have dealt only with external appearances and behaviors and have found they may vary from time to time and from one situation to another. In addition they may be interpreted by some individuals or groups in one way, by others quite differently. And finally there may be deliberate intent to deceive, or for personal gain. Obviously then, the outer self is not the real you. Sometimes you wonder. You catch a sudden glimpse of yourself in a certain role, and you protest: "No, this is not I. This shrill-voiced creature can't be me!" Or, "I'm not this solemn, know-it-all fellow—or am I?" Or on occasion, you applaud: "How polished I look! How attractive! Am I like that?" Or, "Perhaps this is just a fellow, popular and relaxed is what I am really like."

But although no one role or behavior or appearance you assume, or even a combination of them is the real you, everything about you is in a way related and does give an indication of your personality.

It will come as no surprise that the outer one and that it is this inner self that explains behavior seemingly inconsistent or deceptive. Now there are not two selves but the inner and outer self are both aspects of the one self. The outer self, say the psychologists, gives the "what" of behavior; the inner aspect of the self gives the

"why" of behavior. For an understanding of the real you, or your true personality, it is necessary then to know what goes on in the inner as well as the outer self. It is any wonder that we constantly misjudge each other? To appraise fairly even the self appears to others is a complex undertaking. To know as fully as present insight into human nature permits, the inner world of any individual is a task for a wise and highly trained psychiatrist. But just as medical science can do much with its incomplete knowledge of polio or cancer, and the layman who knows the signals and follows direction can help save a great many lives, understanding even that there is generally something else than willfulness, meanness or disrespect back of a child's (or adult's) behavior may be highly constructive.

What is this world that can lend meaning to what otherwise we give up with a shrug or with despair.—"I simply cannot make you out," we say; "you act as if you are possessed." "Your one object in life seems to make it as hard for me as possible."

What is this inner world of the individual and how does it come into being? One psychologist stated that two small children playing side by side in a sand-box may live in separate worlds. To one born into a home where he is treated with love and consideration, the world, his world, seems kind and responsive. Being sure he is precious to the chief people in the world, his parents, and those who come to his home, he meets all
