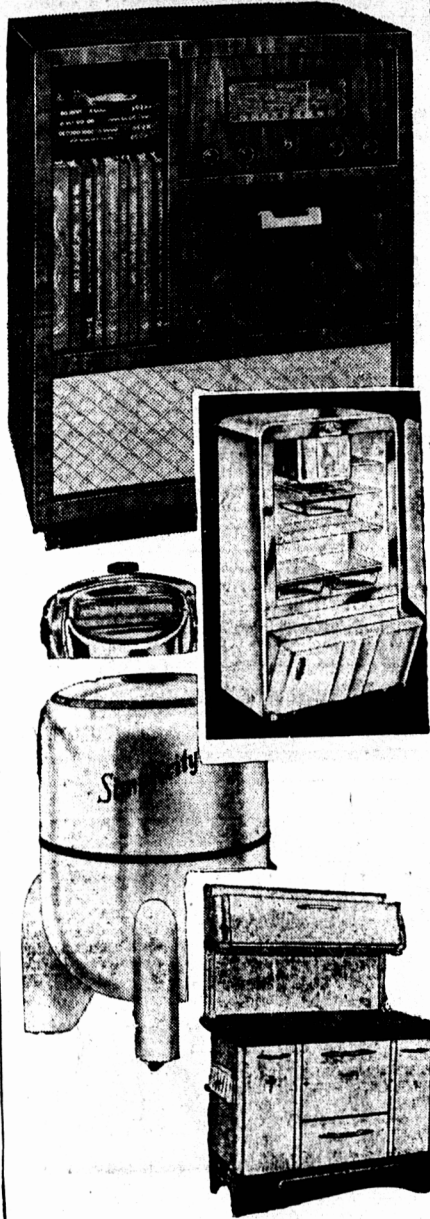

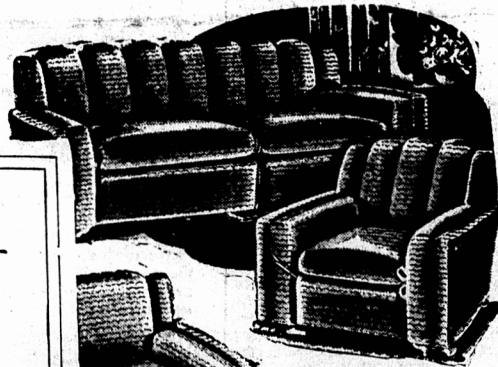

## IN MEMORIAM

### MRS. PATRICK P. DUFFY

On Tuesday, Nov. 7, 1950, the angel of death visited the community of Fort Augustus and claimed as its prize one of the oldest residents in the person of Mrs. Patrick Duffy. The late Mrs. Duffy was born eighty-two years ago in Fort Augustus, the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry McGuirk. "Here lies a Christian" is the greatest epitaph which can be given to any person. To very few could this epitaph be more truly applied. The true mark of a Christian is his charity. The double aspect of this virtue, love of God and love of neighbor, the late Mrs. Duffy exemplified to a very high degree. Her love of God could be clearly seen by her frequent attendance at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Until the last year of her life she was a familiar figure at the parish church where she came to offer adoration and thanksgiving to her Lord. Her love of neighbor was no less visible. The door of her home was ever open to receive all and her heart was ever open to sympathize with the trials and sorrows of others.

Her final illness, which lasted for a year she bore with that Christian fortitude and patience which can be found only in one who places all trust in God. The loving tenderness of her sons and daughters could not, however, stay the hand of death and on the above date, surrounded by her family, including Father Henry, her son, her gentle spirit broke its earthly bonds and winged its way to meet its maker whence it had come. She leaves to mourn their loss the following sons and daughters—Rudolph, Seattle, Wash.; Father Henry, Alberta; Patrick E., Fort Augustus; Albert, N.Y.; Leo J., Ch'town.; Earl, Fort Augustus; May (Mrs. Frank Walsh), N.Y.; Ella (Mrs. Frank Koughan), Donagh.

Waiting reunion with us in eternity. Her funeral which was held on Thursday, Nov. 9th to St. Patrick's Church, Fort Augustus, was a fitting tribute to one who had spent her life in love and service. A large concourse of people thronged the church to assist at Solemn Requiem High Mass which was offered by her son, Rev. Henry Duffy. Assisting as deacon was Rev. Louis P. Callaghan D.D. with Rev. T. P. Butler P.P. as subdeacon and Rev. V. G. Murnaghan as master of ceremonies. Seated in the sanctuary were Rev. Phalen McKenna P.P., Morell, and Rev. William Simpson, St. Dunstan's University. She was laid to rest in the church cemetery by the side of her husband who predeceased her by thirteen years. Services at the grave were conducted by Rev. Henry Duffy assisted by Rev. Louis P. Callaghan. The pallbearers were Joseph Duffy, Frank Kelly, Charlie McGuirk, Albert Murnaghan, Louis Heron, Ambrose Kelly. "May she rest in peace."
