home sign for the Basketball and Hockey teams. Check the library roof.

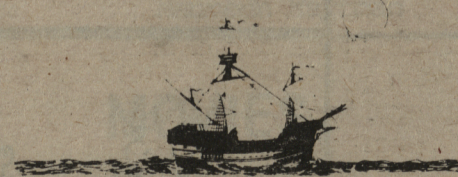
- that UPEI delivers the wild card for the Hockey nationals.
