DICTIONARY MAKING.
THE PRIMARY OBJECT OF A LEXICOGRAPHER IN HIS WORK.
The Esteem in Which Great Literary Men Hold a Good Dictionary—Something About the Methods in Vogue While the Making Proceeds.

Dr. Holmes is reported to have said that if he could only have three books he would choose the Bible, Shakespeare and the Dictionary. He added that few people fully appreciated the interest as well as the usefulness of a dictionary.

For example, take the word aluminum or aluminium. It is a recent scientific term. The spelling has varied, and the pronunciation the first form, others the second. In such a case, in favor of which shall the lexicographer decide? If he gives both equally authoritative, nothing is settled.

Besides gathering information regarding words directly from individuals, the work of all reputable authors must be searched in order to learn the various meanings in common usage. With the growing demand of civilization, the coinage of new words does not keep up with the demand, and hence there is a constant tendency to make new applications of old words, often metaphorically.

This enormous vocabulary having been finished, each word is copied on separate numbered blank cards, which are bunched in groups of twenty-five. Four of these packages are given to a definer. Hereafter, only original work of the new dictionary. The definition is the basis of such a work; it is the frame to which all the other parts of it are subsidiary. There must also be special lists for cross-references.

When the "definer's" work is done, then the definitions go up to the "reviser," who adds to them, as occasion may require, but more often finds it necessary to draw his pen ruthlessly across word after word, diffusing in definition being one of the greatest difficulties to overcome. Then follow the quotations, gathered from the whole range of literature and science, giving the authorities for the variants in the meanings of a word. This is a most perplexing task; for the editor of this department not only has to select from many scores of quotations offered him, but he must have so wide and thorough a literary knowledge as to be able to make the most judicious selection. The package of definitions and quotations are then sent to the pasteur's work, where the selected quotations are attached to the respective words. And now we come to the type-writer's work. What trouble and cost might have been saved to the lexicographers of old if but the type-writer had been known to them! The amount of work involved simply in this copying process before a single page has been "set up," is indicated by the fact that eighteen copyists were engaged for three years in type-writing half of one of the new dictionaries. The type-written copy must then go through the hands of several editors for final revision.
