

An Influx Of Europeans Affects Young Canadians

The feud between the National Collegiate Athletic Association and the Amateur Athletic Union in the United States over control of track and field has presented one interesting off-shoot: An influx of European athletes for indoor meets in North America.

And, conceivably, it could affect the chances of young Canadians getting to meet south of the border.

There'll be no trouble for Bill Crothers, the Markham, Ont., druggist who won the second-place silver medal in the 800 metres at the Tokyo Olympics, and world-class sprinter Harry Jerome of Vancouver. They are natural drawing cards anywhere.

But the comparative unknowns may have a tough time getting the competition they need. The directors may not have the money available to pay their way to their meets.

"But it isn't just the NCAA-AAU fight," says Ken Twigg, director of the Jan. 29 Toronto Telegram-Maple Leaf Games.

"It just happens that there are more athletes available now than for the past few years. There's an increase in participation in track and field all over the world.

"Additionally, this is not a pressure year. There are no European championships, no Olympic, British Empire or

Pan-American Games. So, it follows that more Europeans than ever are available for competition in North America.

"Then, it seems the AAU in the United States is taking a more active part in the sport. They are bringing in some women athletes from Britain, Europe and Australia and paying their travel expenses. In some cases, the AAU is absorbing the cost; in others, they bill the meet directors.
