

NEWSPAPERMAN DIES
GLASGOW (AP) — Sir Robert Bruce, 83, one of Scotland's best known newspaper men and former editor of the Glasgow Herald, died at his home here Sunday. In the early years of the century he was a parliamentary lobby correspondent for The Herald. He became editor of the paper in 1917 and was knighted the following year. He retired in 1936.
