Sport Echoes From Prince County

Now that the Sydney Millionaires are battling to retain Maritime hockey supremacy it seems that some sort of "rigid controls" must be imposed on the demand of the president of the Millionaires' club. The implication is, of course, that the Islanders' smashing 8 to 1 victory which shook the Maritime hockey world was not a result of Leo Lamoureux's boys' hockey ability, but rather due to their capacity for rising and shining in a pier six brawl. The Millionaires are peace-loving boys, the Cape Bretoners assured us when we were down there week before last, "but if the Islanders really get them riled, watch out." Watch out for whom? Apparently for the president of the club who hollers "murder," when he sees his boys skated and checked into the ice by Vitale & Co.

Well, our boys are no Daffy-downhills, that's sure, but a word of the hospital lists shows no signs of a Millionaire's date. Hal Gordon gets a broken collarbone, Bucko Trainor gets a half-dozen stitches opened up as the result of a savage jab of a stick. Frankie Bathgate is another hospital victim. Certainly not all of this mayhem was the result of legitimate hockey tactics but you haven't heard any Island hockey officials squawking about it, have you?

So far there have been three border-line decisions in regard to the scoring of goals. The first one was in Sydney when the Sydney team claimed a goal off Hal Gordon in the second game. Sports reporters took the play away from the officials on that one, reversing the decision of the refs and goal judge, and intimating that the Millionaires "was robbed." In Charlottetown there have been two questionable decisions: in the middle game a goal was scored (according to the goal judge) but was disallowed by Bradshaw. He could have been mistaken, but little or no fuss was made about it. In the last game MacRae looked to have been in the crease as he scored

We have noticed and have heard many fans comment how far the Islanders have come since the early "smash and grab" November days. Their attack is so much smoother now, and they have both power and precision. We used to say: "The Islanders won, but the losers played smoother hockey." That's not true anymore.

Pick Knute Rockne As All-American Football Coach

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., April 11—(AP)—Knute Rockne, the colorful, pug-nosed strategist who made Notre Dame a household word in football, was chosen coach today of the all-time, all-America football team. The little Norwegian, master of locker-room inspiration, won out over two famous pioneers of the sport, Glenn S. (Pop) Warner and Alonzo Stagg. In the Associated Press country-wide poll of sports editors and broadcasters. The poll was conducted to pick nominees for the national Football Hall of Fame. The names of these three coaches and the players of three all-time, all-America teams, already chosen, will be submitted to the Hall of Fame honors court for possible permanent places in the \$5,000,000 shrine planned at Rutgers University. Rockne was killed in a plane

accident March 31, 1931. But he left behind a brilliant record of achievement. His teams scored 105 victories over a 13-year span against 12 defeats and five ties. He got more than four times as many votes in the poll as his

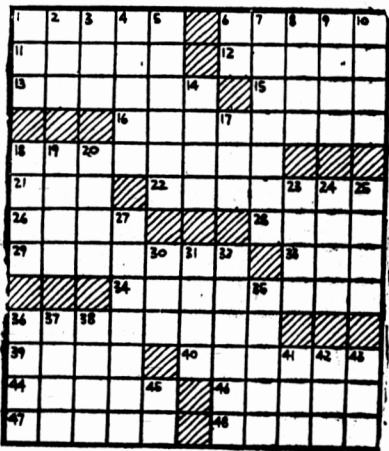

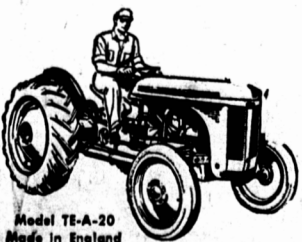

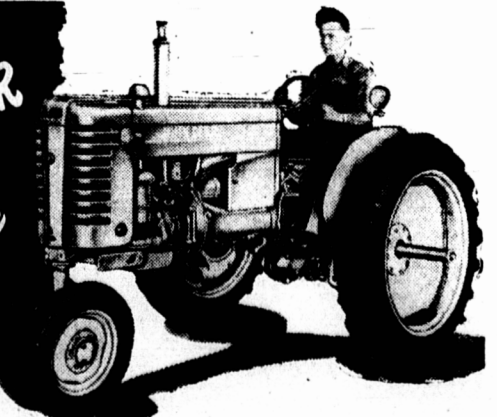
