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some of the consequences of the disastrous seamen's strike, exports for the first half of 1966 are still marginally higher than for the second half of last year, and nearly three per cent more than the average for 1965.

It has been pointed out that the origin of the current crisis is traceable to the war years, when economic losses were sustained that have never been recovered. Twenty years of inflation followed, with overfull employment creating the illusion of a lasting prosperity.

Not To Be Envid

The recent military take-over in Argentina adds another to the growing list of Latin-American countries that now have military governments.

In Brazil and Argentina the army take-over came about because of fear that the weak civilian governments were leaning too far toward Communism.

Col. Julio Rivera, who took over in El Salvador, now has wide support and has made significant changes in the nation's social and economic life.

Whether the minister's little strategy will avert a constitutional fight in this case, is too soon to predict. But as Miss LaMarsh says, the purpose of federal policy is to reflect the direction in which the government would like to go.

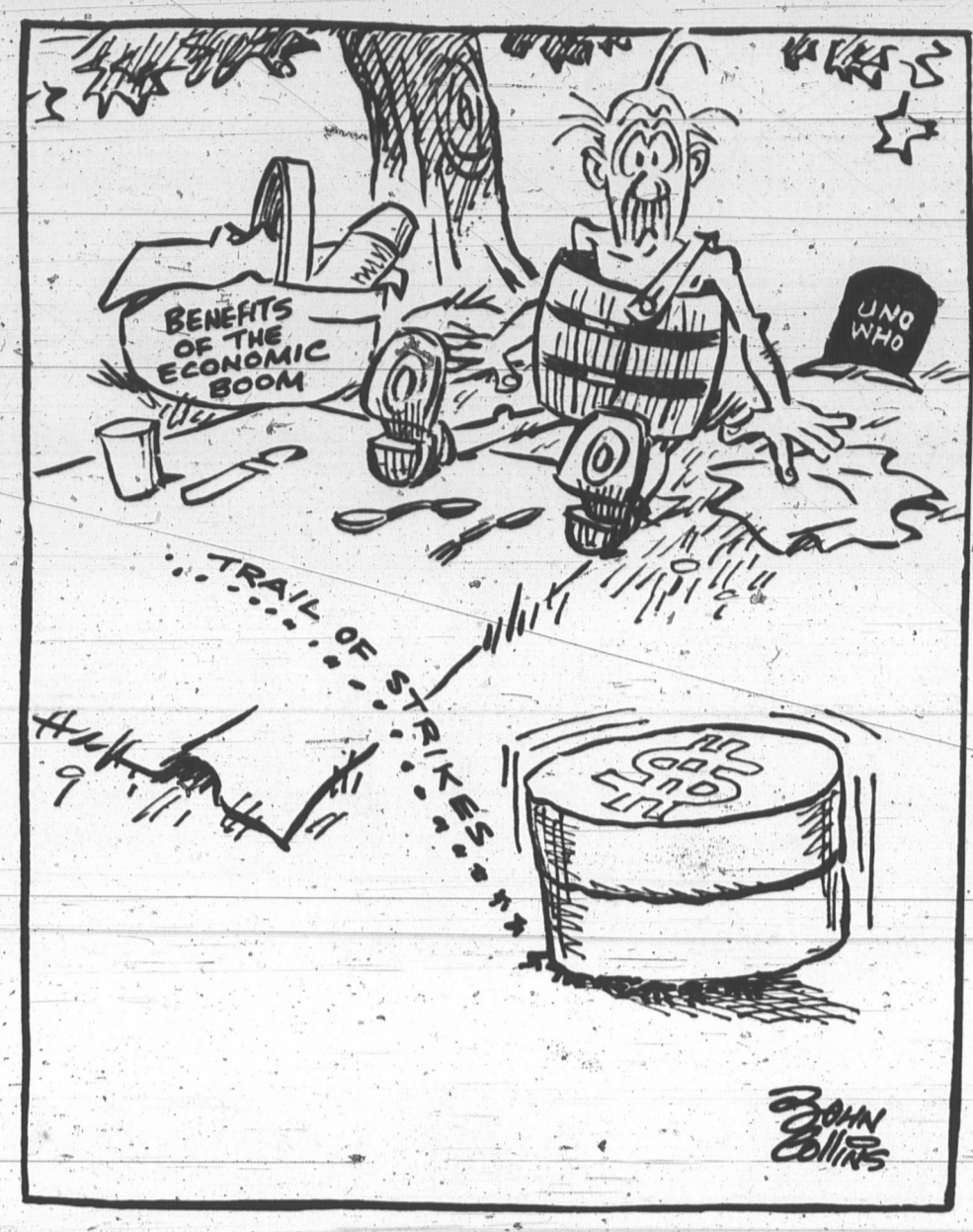
No Easy Task

It was ironic that Britain's deputy prime minister and economics secretary should be left to unveil the Labor government's drastic retrenchment proposals in Parliament last Friday, while Prime Minister Wilson was in Washington.

Mr. Brown had been preaching expansion through his department of economic affairs ever since the Labor party took office in Britain. Standing against him were the traditional policy moulders of the Treasury.

The economics secretary—he was then chancellor of the exchequer as well—actually handed in his resignation over this issue, but before it could be announced he was persuaded back into the cabinet fold.

Trade figures announced by the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom for June show that exports totalled the equivalent of \$968 million, with imports running at \$1,340.8 million.

FACE UNIQUE HAZARDS

Golfers Seek Them In Strange Places

The world's hardy new breed of golfer finds before no geographic hazards—crocodiles in the Congo, Sahara-size sand traps in Saudi Arabia, mountainous fairways in Nepal.

The popular sport invented by Scots in the 15th century is played in more than 30 countries around the world, the National Geographic Society says.

Lebanese players were so eager to have a course near Beirut that they dynamited fairways out of solid rock, trucked soil from miles away, and flew in special turf from abroad.

Lord Parker, Chief Justice of England, disagrees on both counts. In a public speech recently he said not only that such proceedings should be retained in fairness to accused persons but there was need for giving them full publicity as judicial proceedings.

Bees Can Be Anywhere

A person sensitive to the venoms of a bee, wasp, hornet, or yellow jacket must do everything possible to avoid being stung.

Destroy nests about the home. Wasps build small open-bottomed comb-type nests under eaves and other protected places.

Use caution when destroying nests. It should be done at night and preferably by someone with experience who is not allergic to the sting.

A honey bee leaves its stinger in the skin along with the venom sac. It takes a few minutes for the sac to empty its contents and instant removal will lessen the amount injected.

African Members Bitter
