Anglo-American Tenseness Is Played Down in Britain

LONDON (CP) — Reports of a new tenseness in Anglo-American relations found little echo in official British circles.
In point of fact, things are rather dull in official circles. Whitehall officials when asked about suggestions Britain and Canada are in a new phase of tension, again at loggerheads, particularly over Cuba and Egypt, detected "a certain amount of tension," but added this resulted from a continuing difference of opinion on policy, and that there is no sign of deterioration or anything suggestive of a serious press reporting recently about the state of the alliance.
British officials are not suggesting President Johnson speak sharply to British Foreign Minister in Washington about the British state to Cuba, but London spokesmen tend to make light of their reports.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

You are South, both sides vulnerable. The bidding has been:
North East South West
1 ♠ Pass 1 ♠ Pass
What would you now bid in each of the following four hands?
1. ♠A42 ♥KQ9 ♦J74 ♣QJ3
2. ♠J883 ♥9 ♦K2 ♣A97
3. ♠A9865 ♥32 ♦94 ♣K75
4. ♠K86542 ♥AQ3 ♦Q7 ♣6
This contract is quite clear that a game going bid facing an opening bid. The problem to be solved is whether the best chance for game lies in spades or in no-trump.
Having already told partner that we can play a spade contract, we should not suggest the possibility of playing the hand in no-trump. It will turn out that partner has a balanced hand, also, with all the high cards in case he will bid spades and accept the alternative to game. If partner has a good spade support and an upper hand, he will of course correct to four spades.
Two spades while this hand by itself does not constitute an opening bid, it assumes the value of one as soon as a spade fit is discovered. As a matter of fact, this hand with

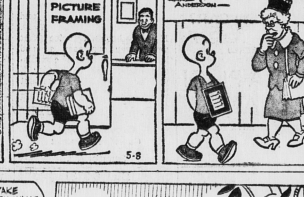
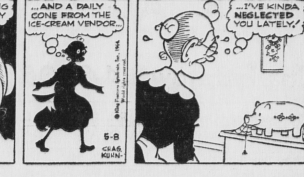

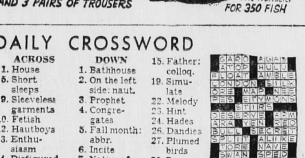
