

**NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS**

Section 9 of the City By-law relating to dogs prohibits dogs being on or about the streets of the City unless in the immediate company, or under the control of owners or competent persons, and provides that all dogs at large shall be delivered to the police and only delivered to the owners upon payment of \$2.00 forfeit in addition to possible fine for infraction. It provides further that dogs habitually at large or difficult to take may be destroyed.

Owing to general complaints of nuisance and depredations the police have been instructed to enforce rigidly the foregoing provisions commencing on June first. Dog owners should take warning and should enquire at the police station if their dogs are missing. Dated at Charlottetown May 29th, 1936.

**TORONTO, May 30**—Omega-Manager A. D. Campbell of Omega estimates ore reserves at 440,000 tons averaging .197 ounces per ton or close to \$7 per ton and in addition to the ore thus computed, a considerable low grade tonnage though indicated has not been developed sufficiently to permit its inclusion in a reserve calculation.

Buffalo Ankerite—Is increasing output steadily. The outlook at the middle of May was that output from the No. 1 mill for the months of May would be over \$100,000 and with an additional \$35,000 from the No. 2 plant.

**MONTREAL, May 31**—Butter and potato prices were higher on Montreal open produce markets this week. Cheese and eggs held steady.

Butter was quoted at 20 1-4 to 2-4 cents a pound for carlots or less of no 1 while lots to retailers were 21 to 21 1-2 for solids and 2 1-2 to 2 2 for prints.

Cheese was quoted at 12 cents a pound for no 1 Ontario colored, current arrivals, and 12 1-4 for white.

Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were quoted at 21 1-2 to 22 cents a dozen for A large; 20 to 21 1-2 for A medium, 19 1-2 to 20 for B and 18 1-2 to 19 for C.

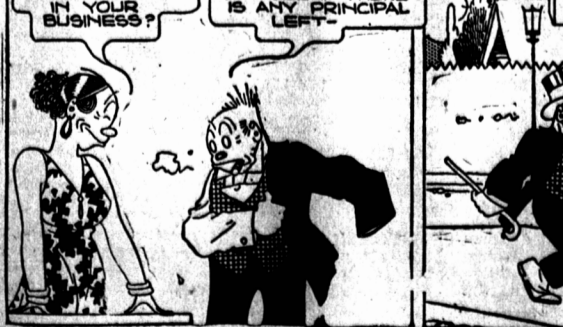

## Dull Session On Montreal Stock Mart

(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire)

**MONTREAL, May 31**—Listings on Montreal Stock Exchange, minus the influence of holiday-taking Wall Street, eased through two dull hours Saturday.

Turnover was less than 10,000 shares and the market was devoid of a feature. Price changes, except in Bank of Canada which lost a point, were fractional.

Metal stocks and a few building materials showed a little strength but liquors were slightly weaker. Regular trends were displayed by utilities.

Hollinger, in good buying gained to 16 1-2 and Consolidated Smelting finished at 56 3-4, up 1-2 and 1-4 respectively. While Nickel held even, Noranda eased 1-2.

In the utilities, Steel of Canada preferred and Montreal Power went fractionally higher while Brazilian and Shawinigan dropped from 1-8 to 3-4.

Canadian Industrial Alcohol and Distillers Seagram eased a little. Sales 9,842; bonds \$3,400.
