The crewmen, holding a reunion here, accidentally fired a torpedo at the battleship Iowa as it was en route to the Teheran conference of 1943 with the late president. Franklin D. Roosevelt aboard. Will Suggest 25 Million In Scholarships

WINNIPEG (CP) — External Affairs Minister Sidney Smith said Monday night he will recommend to his government a plan to distribute \$25,000,000 among university students in the form of scholarships and bursaries. He said in an interview statistics revealed about 15 per cent of Canadian university students get aid compared with about 70 per cent in British colleges. His plan would call for \$6,250,000 to first-year students in its first year of operation and about \$12,500,000 to first- and second-year students in the next year. By the fourth year the plan would distribute about \$25,000,000 to all students. The scholarships would average about \$600 each and would send about 40,000 more students to universities. Mr. Smith, former president of the universities of Toronto and Manitoba, said he also thinks a change in the housing act could be made to permit universities to borrow from Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation under favorable terms for construction of university residences. He is on a three-day tour of Manitoba.

H.B.C. Profits Show Increase

LONDON (CP) — The Hudson's Bay Company Tuesday announced its net profit for the year ended Jan. 31, 1958, was \$6,474,000, compared with \$5,347,000 for 1957. The sum represents a profit of \$1.15 per share, an increase of 20 cents over the 1957 figure of 95 cents. Trading profit before taxes was \$12,121,000, up \$854,000 from the 1957 total of \$11,267,000. The company also announced a final dividend of 16 per cent, making a total for the year of 20 per cent from trading.

MONTREAL (CP) — Quebec was advised last night by federal Mines Minister Comtois to vote with the head March 31 rather than with the heart. Rt. Hon. Louis St. Laurent, the former Liberal prime minister now retired from active politics, had drawn Quebec's votes in past elections, Mr. Comtois said. "Mr. St. Laurent is a fine man of integrity, honored by all of us, but his time is finished." Sentiment rather than "real insight into problems" was the factor on which the Liberal party based its expectation that Quebec would vote for a man of its language and culture. Mr. Comtois spoke in support of Jean Marion, Progressive Conservative candidate in Montreal St. Denis.

Three Ships Arrive To Load Pulp, Produce At Souris

Three ships docked at Souris harbor Saturday. The M. V. Sux, registered out of Panama, is loading approximately 800 cords of peeled pulp for Italy. Loading operations are already underway and will be completed late today. The pulpwood is being supplied by the P. E. I. Produce Company. The Flojald, under the command of Captain Cormier, arrived from the Magdalen Islands to take on a cargo of potatoes, and the Axiel from Newfoundland will load mixed produce.
