Fish Processing Plant For N. B.

FREDERICTON, Sept. 6.—(CP)—Officials of Gordon Fawcett (New Brunswick) Ltd. today signed contracts for the construction of a fish processing and cold storage plant at Carleton Place, N. B.

Construction of the plant will begin tomorrow, Dr. Paterson said, and the building will be completed "this fall." The plant will cost in the vicinity of \$300,000, of which the New Brunswick Government has guaranteed a maximum of \$150,000.

Prices of today's individual contracts were not announced. Contracts for the factory building went to Caldwell contractors, Ltd. of Fredericton; the refrigeration plant contract to the Linde Canadian Refrigeration Co., Ltd., Montreal and the insulating contract to the Armstrong Cork and Insulation Co., Ltd., Montreal.
