Book Review

*The Surreal Gourmet Entertains:
High fun, Low stress dinner parties
for 6 to 12 people*
Written and illustrated by Bob Blumer
(Chronicle Books)

Whoa! Before you stop reading this, you should know that the author of the cookbook considers a dinner party to be anything from you and your buds at the BBQ to a formal evening.

Bob Blumer covers everything involved in the party process in this truly one of a kind book, from actual recipes to what to do if you guests get bored.

The recipes themselves look yummy and are written so that the most exotic dish can be prepared by the Kraft Dinner Crowd. The recipes include what music to use for accompaniment, how to make alterations using new ingredients, and hints for the "Adventure Club". This is a slub for those of you who want to take your dining experience one step further. The dishes he concocts, such as Mambo Chicken, will have you drooling as you turn the pages.

This book is not just about recipes. There are original suggestions covering everything from how to avoid making a dessert, how to create concept meals like a Salvador Dali or all Elvis meal, who to invite, and what to stock in your kitchen.

Even if you will never throw a dinner party, the surreal art will make this book worthwhile. Scattered throughout the book are surreal illustrations of the recipes, and other kitchen paraphernalia. *The Surreal Gourmet Entertains* follows the first book entitled *The Surreal Gourmet: Real Food for Pretend Chefs*. Bob Blumer is not just the only known surreal chef, he is Jane Siberry's musical manager. He believes that preparing and cooking a meal should take no longer than it take to listen to an average album.

I cannot decide whether this entertaining feast should rest in my kitchen or on a coffee table. Either way, Blumer's wacky ideas and sumptuous meals will have you planning a party in no time.
