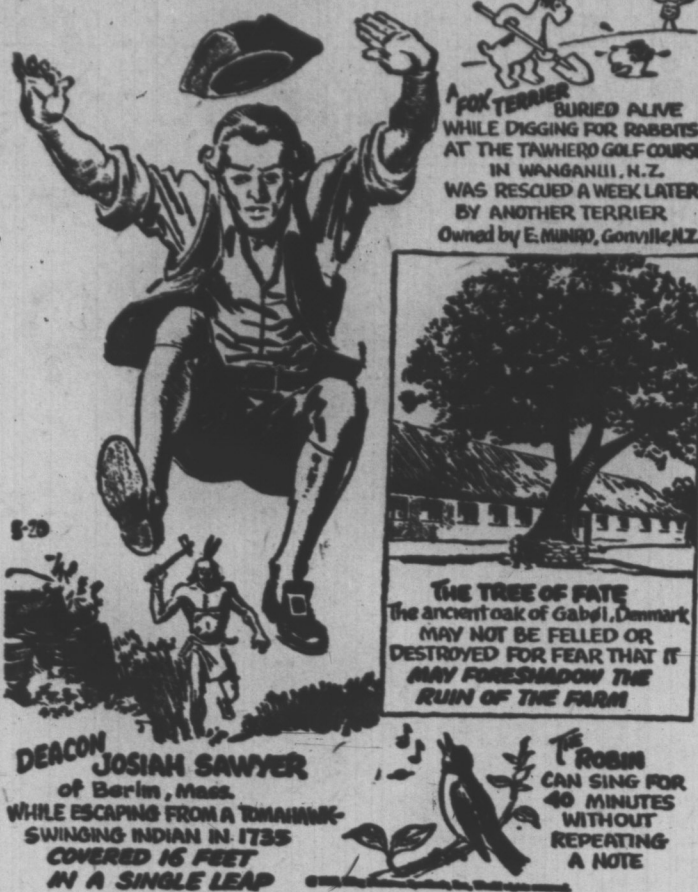

CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. West-West vulnerable.

Hand:

South: ♠ 9 5 4 3, ♥ 10 8 7 6, ♦ K Q 2, ♣ K 9 5

hearts. Though his trump support was meager, he had to respect South's bidding. The combination of the double followed by the two heart bid indicated a strong hand.

West led the king of spades and continued with the queen. When everybody followed, he could count three defensive tricks. The question was where the fourth could come from.

It was hardly likely, on the bidding, that East would have either the ace of diamonds or king of clubs. South's bidding had been too strong to warrant such a hope.

The setting trick, if there was to be one, had to come from the trump suit. If East had an honor in hearts—the king, queen, or jack—defeat of the contract would take care of itself, since the defense would automatically make two trump tricks with the aid of the A-10-6.

But if East had none of the key cards—the diamond ace, the club king, or a heart honor—there still remained one hope. East might have been dealt the innocuous seven of hearts.

At trick three, therefore, West led the three of spades, deliberately forcing East to ruff the spade. It did not require great imagination for East to realize he was being asked to ruff with his highest trump.

He trumped with the seven and South had to lose two trump tricks and go down one.

Opening lead—king of spades. East's hand turned out to be instrumental in defeating four hearts, though it is a little hard to see how his array of cards could be of value in this hand.

South made the proper choice of doubling a spade after North and East had passed. Sitting in the protective position after the bidding had died at one spade, South realized it was more important for him first to identify general strength than to show the heart suit immediately.

A direct overcall of two hearts would have indicated only a desire to compete for the part score. It would ordinarily be based on a hand of less than opening bid strength.

Conservative Attacks Crown Corp. Secrecy

OTTAWA (CP) — A group of Progressive Conservative MPs Friday sought to crack the longstanding practice of secrecy in competitive commercial dealings of Crown corporations.

Four of them at a meeting of the Commons broadcasting committee demanded that the CBC disclose its losses on some of its big television programs.

The issue was opened by Art Smith (PC—Calgary South), who said costs of some shows are reported to be "tremendous" with payments by sponsors falling far short of covering production cost. The committee should have information to show whether the programs "are being produced with any regard to cost."

NOT ETHICAL

E. L. Bushnell, CBC vice-president testifying for the publicly-owned corporation, demurred. He said it would not be "ethical" to give information on production costs and sponsors' payments.

The CBC and its sponsors were in "a highly competitive business."

He flatly denied a suggestion by Mr. Smith that commercial revenues of some TV productions cover only 20 per cent of costs.

Committee Chairman Ernest Halpenny (PC—London) said the decision on disclosure of the information would be made by the committee's steering group, which meets in private.
