### Joyriding Charge Brings Jail Term

GEORGETOWN — A sentence of two months in jail was imposed on a resident of Murray

River, Vernon MacKay, by Stipendiary Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudet, Q.C., in Kings County magistrate's court yesterday.

He pleaded guilty to a charge of joy riding. MacKay took a car owned by Dr. M. Lorne Bonnell while the doctor was making a call. MacKay was arrested after the car was found extensively damaged in a ditch a few miles away.

A resident of Montague had a charge against him of the care and control of a motor vehicle while intoxicated withdrawn, and a charge laid against him of being intoxicated in a public place, to which he pleaded guilty and was fined \$20 and costs.

A resident of Gaspereaux pleaded guilty to having liquor in his possession which had not been purchased from a vendor and was fined \$25 and costs.

A resident of St. Mary's Road was fined \$5 and costs for disturbing the peace by blowing a motor vehicle horn in the town of Montague.

Ian M. MacLeod, Crown prosecutor for Kings, represented the Crown in all cases.

Place 3 balls in each section of greased muffin pans. Brush balls with melted butter or margarine. Cover. Let rise until doubled in bulk, about 1 hour. Bake in a hot oven, 400°, about 15 minutes. Yield—16 gems.
