Ceiling Taken Off Meals in Britain

LONDON, May 1 (AP) - Food Minister Maurice Webb took the ceiling off the price of meals in British restaurants today in a bid to earn more dollars from tourists. The meal price has been limited to five shillings (about 75 cents). Restaurant owners have complained bitterly for years that they could not serve top quality food at such a price. The limit also has led to the imposition of extra charges for bread, butter, coffee and services-which have turned the regulation into a farce. Meals at high grade restaurants and night clubs, with the charges added in, run as high as 15 shillings. Webb said the limit is off at least for the summer, when the tourist influx is heaviest.
