The Pope is expected to deliver an important speech at the Consistory early next month.

Mr. Holloway, of England, has given \$2,000,000 to endow an institution for the higher education of women.

The editor of the Lunenburg, N. S., Progress is boasting that he has just been presented with a bunch of Mayflowers in full bloom.

One of the giant trees of the Cavalera grove in California is named Otto von Bismarck. An admirer of the German Premier, resident in San Francisco, has just sent him a five-foot photograph of the tree, expressly for this purpose, and enclosed in an elaborate frame of native woods.

The Princess Louise has evidently made herself a prime favorite in British Columbia. At the citizens' banquet to the Governor-General in Victoria, the Provincial Premier, Hon. Mr. Beaven, in the course of his speech, offered to release the Dominion Government from their obligation to build the Island Railway, if the Imperial and Dominion Governments would allow Vancouver Island to be formed into a separate kingdom with the Princess as Queen, and the suggestion, we are told, was received with rapturous applause.

Everybody has not heard, remarks the St. James Gazette, that the Count de Hatzfeldt, the new Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs at Berlin, is a descendant of the prince who was Governor of Berlin when the town fell into the hands of the French, in October, 1806, and who so narrowly escaped execution by order of Napoleon. The prince had sent a letter to the King of Prussia, giving details of the French forces, and this letter was intercepted and conveyed to the Emperor. The Count's professions to publish for the first time a letter written by Napoleon to Josephine, explaining how it came to pass that the prince was not summarily disposed of by a firing party after his capture. The following is a translation of this letter, which, apart from the incidents of war, to which it relates, is interesting as a concise statement of Napoleon's views on the subject of women: "I received your letter wherein you appeared vexed, dear friend, at the things I say of women. I hate intriguing women beyond expression. I am accustomed to good, gentle, and confiding women. These I love; and if they have spoiled me it is not my fault, it is yours. Now you will see that I have been kind to one who showed that she was a good woman—a woman of feeling—Mme. de Hatzfeldt. When I showed her her husband's letter she said to me simply, yet with deep emotion, sobbing at the time: 'Ah, it is indeed his writing.' The admission touched my soul. I was pained, and said to her: 'En bien, madame throw the letter in the fire. I am no longer able to pass sentence on your husband.' She burned the letter and seemed very happy. From that time her husband has been quite at ease; two hours later he would have been lost. You see, therefore, that I like women who are good, ingenious, and gentle—such alone as resemble you. Adieu, my friend Truly yours, NAPOLEON."
