Haiti Braces For Flora

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—Hurricane Flora whirled Thursday toward a midnight collision with Haiti. Her howling, 140-mile-an-hour winds and torrential rains threatened that tropical Negro land with heavy loss of life and great destruction.

Government of the Dominican Republic has been notified of the hurricane's approach. In Florida, residents breathed relief as the hurricane gradually changed its course from west-northwest in this direction to north. Strong westerly winds aloft promised to nudge Flora, a killer that already has taken at least 17 lives, away from the state.
