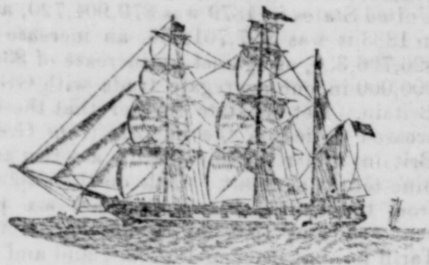

PARLIAMENTARY CORRESPONDENCE.

OTTAWA, March, 5.

PROHIBITION.

To-day is remarkable as the day on which was begun, in Parliament, the agitation for a prohibitory Liquor Law. The subject was introduced by Mr. Foster, by means of a resolution in the following terms:—

Resolved, That the object of good government is to promote the general welfare of the people by a careful encouragement and protection of whatever makes for the public good, and by an equally careful discouragement and suppression of whatever tends to the public disadvantage.

That the traffic in alcoholic liquors as beverages is productive of serious injury to the moral, social and industrial welfare of the people of Canada.

That despite all preceding legislation the evils of intemperance remain so vast in magnitude, so wide in extent and so destructive in effect as to constitute
