Toronto Stocks

TORONTO, (CP)—Stock market prices fell back Monday from a firm opening with only golds showing a gain. Observers blamed the losses on uncertain conditions caused by the possibility of peace in Korea. Golds held firm. Western oils and base metals weakened. Volume totalled 4,499,000 shares. Eastern Metals dropped 20 cents in a turnover of 237,000 shares. Uranium trading lower as Gun-nar, Nesbit-Labine and New Delhi slipped. New Brunswick base metals weakened with Brunswick dropping \$1.25. Western oils lost. Redwater, Canada Southern, Devon Leduc and Dome Exploration were lower but Central Leduc and New Superior were up. Senior golds gained and juniors continued firm. Higher-priced base metals slipped with Hudson Bay dropping 75 cents. Mountauban, United Keno and Barvue gained.

Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL, (CP)—The stock market was firmly settled in lower territory as an active session came to a close Monday. International Paper, Noranda, Hudson Bay Mining and Dominion Bridge lost a point or more. Utilities were higher, but all other groups were lower. Papers and senior metals were most prominent in the decline. Aluminum, International Nickel, Abitibi and BC Forest fell. Also lower were Asbestos Corporation, Seagrams, Imperial Oil, Canadian Car, OPR and Bank of Commerce. Shawinigan and Massey Harris strengthened. Mines remained higher. Inspiration added 55 cents at \$3.50 and Frobiher was better by 15 cents at \$7.85. Belleville, Chimo and Rix Athabasca rose pennies. Cassiar was off 20 cents at \$4.10. Western oils were mixed. Antone, Pacific Petroleum and Gaspe were up but Del Rio and New Continental were down.

New York Stocks

NEW YORK, (AP)—New Communist peace gestures involving an exchange of prisoners in Korea touched off heavy selling Monday in the stock market causing the widest break in more than two years. Aircrafts, steels, motors, railroads, chemicals, oils, and a long list of stocks of companies with heavy defence orders were depressed sharply. Losses of two to four points were frequent in the list, and nearly 70 per cent of all stocks traded declined. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks dropped \$2.00 at \$112.80. That is the most it has declined since it was off \$2.20 on Dec. 4, 1950. The industrial component and the railroad's component each lost \$2.40 while the utilities were down 50 cents. Volume mounted to 2,740,000 shares. Pacific Western Oil, which has new developments in the Iranian Gulf area, was the most active stock of the day was up 5 3-4 at 45 1-4, with 65,100 shares traded. Higher were American Home Products, General Foods, Woolworth, Union Pacific and Homestake Mining. A few stocks on the losing side were Atlantic Coast Line, Southern Railway, Northern Pacific, Sinclair Oil, United Air Lines, Paramount Pictures, American Telephone, Anaconda Copper, Union Carbide, General Electric, U. S. Steel, Republic Steel, General Motors, Chrysler, Goodrich, Boeing, Douglas Aircraft, United Aircraft, Consolidated Vultee, Admiral Cor. and Radio Cor.

WINNIPEG, (CP)—Prices dropped lower, especially rice, Monday on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange on increased offerings prompted by declines on U. S. stock and commodity markets, reflecting peace overtures. Highlight of the export trade was reports of the disposal of a cargo of Canadian barley to Spain and further amounts to other countries. This business was indicated in the trade here, along with some shipper purchases in both oats and barley. The offerings, however, outweighed the demand. American intermarket spreading, found support thin in rice. Light industrial buying appeared in flax during the active session. No information was available on export wheat loadings. Prices for class two wheat, top grades, were down two cents from Friday. IWA prices were unchanged. Oats: May 73%; Jly 71%; B; Oct. 71% A. Barley: May 1.21%; Jly 1.16%; B; Oct. 1.15% A. Rye: May 1.55%; Jly 1.58%; Oct. 1.61%; B. Flax: May 3.19%; Jly 3.19%; B; Oct. 3.19% B.
