THE TRINITY

The way to think wrongly about Lenten Sunday is to think of it apart from the rest of the Christian year. When that is done, when the truth which it celebrates is viewed in isolation, as a statement about the being of God comparable to some highly abstract mathematical formula or philosophical theory, the right perspective is lacking, with, as a result, distrust and perplexity.

The right way is to be found by taking note of the fact that Trinity Sunday has its place as a climax, not as a starting point.

In the order of logical cause and consequence it would come first, since, clearly, all that God has done in making himself known to men and on behalf of men follows from what God is. But in the order of history and experience it is otherwise. There it is from the works of God that the mind rises to such apprehension of the divine nature as its limited powers allow.

The question, "Who is this God of whom you speak?" receives an answer which looks to mighty acts which he has done. The enlargement of thought proceeds in an atmosphere of faith and adoration, of thankfulness and exultation, since God has revealed so much

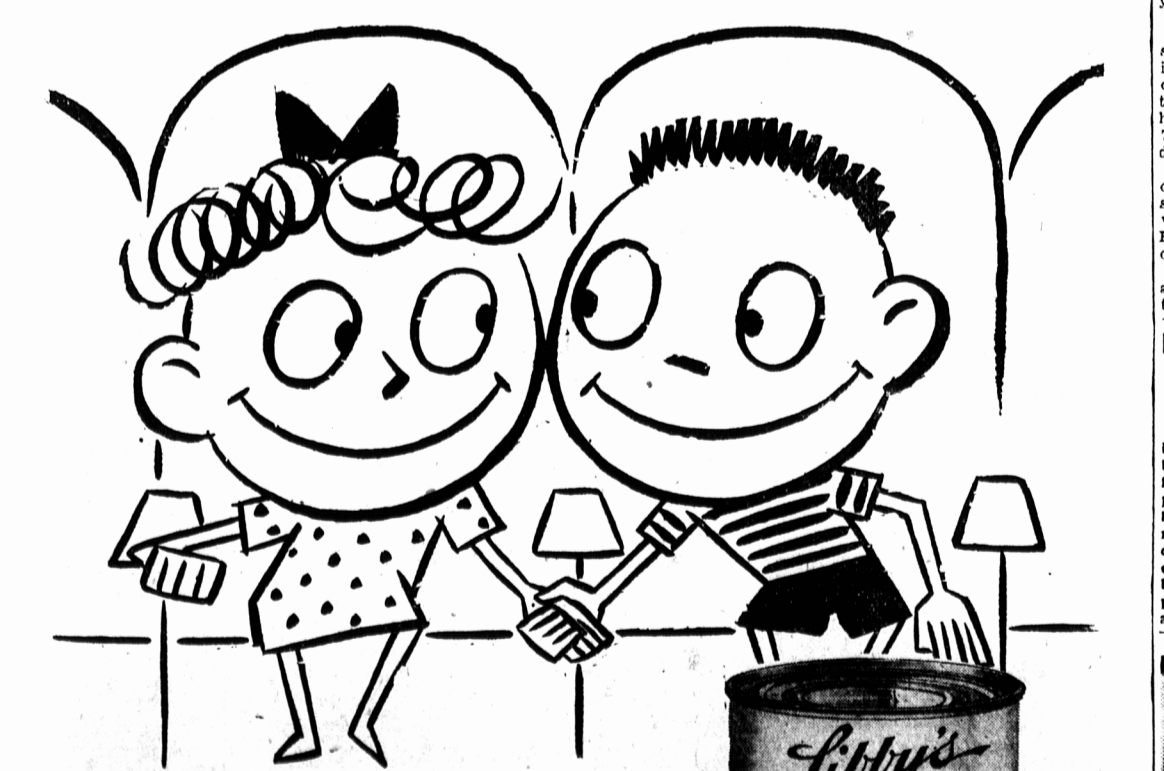
