"TO BE A PILGRIM"

"As I walked through the wilderness of this world"—a treasury of Christian tradition has been distilled into that opening phrase. It introduces the epic of the pilgrim travelling on his journey through life, "from this world to that which is to come"—intent, single-minded, and resolute, with his eyes focused on the heavenly goal.

Life, for such a traveller, has a purpose to which all else must be subordinated. It is probation for an eternal destiny, which invests every passing hour with grandeur and every moral choice with solemnity. Thus conceived, man's life is dignified by the consciousness of a divine vocation, as it is enriched with vast responsibility.

This valuation rooted in Christendom is deeply but this otherworldly note is now seldom heard. It is hard to deny that something of great importance is fading out of the modern outlook with it.

Anyone can show that the picture was one-sided. Many Christian insights were obscured in it. There was, for example, little appreciation of the beauty, the interest and the opportunities of this temporal order of creation; man should not move in his Father's world blindfolded. The pilgrim may underrate the claims and the question still sounds: what shall this very concentration on the man give in exchange for his worth of man's immortal soul?

Maybe some people would pat you on the back for your martyrdom—I won't! Subjecting your children to an influence that will ultimately make nervous wrecks out of all of them is not acting for their good! If you are now separated from your husband, stay that way. Peace of mind, harmony and contentment are the greatest gifts you can have, or hand on to your offspring. Don't return them to a home of discord, fighting and blasphemy.
