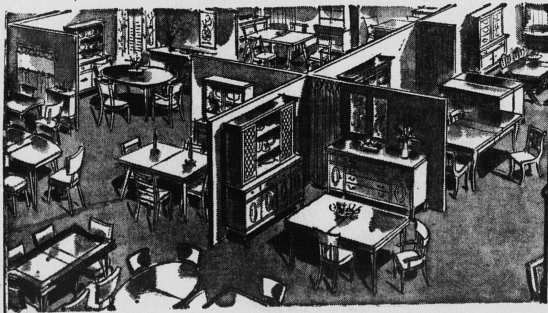

## Government Washes Hands Over Conflict Of Interest

OTTAWA (CP)—The government has apparently waded its hands of possible conflict-of-interest cases involving the defence department and defence industry.

Defence Minister Holyer told Robert Coates, Conservative MP for Cumberland, in a Commons return that the government doesn't plan to take any steps to determine the number of retired senior military officers who are employed by firms which hold defence contracts.

In an earlier Commons return Mr. Holyer informed Mr. Coates there is no requirement for such officers to report their civilian employment to the defence department.

Mr. Coates was out of town and not immediately available for comment on whether he intends to pursue the matter further.

Mr. Coates has asked whether the government had tried to determine the number of retired senior officers now employed with certain firms doing defence business with the government.

He specifically named Canadian Limited, de Havilland Aircraft, Canadian Aviation Electronics, RCA Victor, Canadian Marconi, Hawker Siddeley, Canadian Vickers, Litton Systems, Canadian Pratt and Whitney, Canadian Westinghouse, Collins Radio and Computing Devices.

The matter came before the Commons after reports a month ago some government officers were expressing concern over what appeared to be a growing close association between the defence industry.

A small but increasing number of senior officers with intimate knowledge of long-range defence policy and defence procurement plans are leaving the defence department to take top
