Former Swimming Queen's Marriage On Broadway Ends

NEW YORK. (AP)—Billy Rose finally won his freedom from Eleanor Holm Thursday, digging in to his bankroll for \$30,000-a-year alimony plus a \$200,000 settlement. They agreed to divorce before summer.

The dark-haired former swimming queen thus ends a 15-year marriage to the Broadway showman with a guaranteed \$500,000 during the next 10 years, provided she does not remarry.

The couple worked out their divorce two weeks ago over a midnight cup of coffee in Billy's Beekman Place mansion and thus halted Broadway's sensational two-year "war of the Roses."

"Too bad neither of us had sense enough to have that cup of coffee 24 months ago," lamented Billy.

The \$200,000 settlement is to be paid during a 10-year period, whether or not the 39-year-old Eleanor remarries. Assuming she stays single during the decade, the added alimony will give her almost \$1,000 a week. She has been drawing \$700-a-week temporary alimony since Nov. 30, 1951—probably a record of its kind in New York.

Eleanor, in turn, waived any interest in Billy's estate, gave him back his Beekman Place home and agreed to a divorce before April 10.

In his long battle with Eleanor, the 54-year-old showman actually threw in the towel 17 months ago when he dropped his divorce action and adultery charges. He said then he had neither "the stomach nor the heart to engage in a

duel-slinging contest with Eleanor." Billy and Eleanor married when she starred in his World's Fair aquacade in 1939. There are no children.

Shipbuilding

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only two ships built in this ten-year period.

During the period 1890 to 1900 there was a further falling off in building, only 52 ships were registered, with seven between 101 and 200 tons, four between 201 and 300 tons and two others over 300 tons, of which the 'Cosmo', built by John Yip at Grand River was the largest.

With the beginning of the present century most of the shipyards were closing out. In the ten year period 1901 to 1910 only 39 ships were registered and between 1911 and 1920 the registration fell off to 18, mostly small, from 100 to 300 tons.

From 1921 to 1947 only 29 were built, only one of which was over 100 tons.

In the compiling of this report, of what was in the last century probably the Island's biggest industry, it was necessary to carefully examine each year's records as found by Mr. Ellis, endeavouring to show when possible where the ships were built or registered, size of ship, showing number of each size (No record of the class of ships built is shown) and in cases of large building centers and builders the name of same.

Some difference is shown between the actual building and the registration records. This is due to the fact that almost every year some ships were built in other provinces and registered on the Island.

There is also quite a discrepancy in the earlier years of building, due to the fact that no actual building records are available, and ships entered at the Customs by the agents or owners were in many cases ships that came to the Island with cargo or to load same.

I cannot complete this report without extending to Mr. Chandler,

the Provincial Librarian, my thanks for enabling me to have the records and other assistance so kindly given.

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length, but the fact that East had doubled six clubs after hearing such strong vulnerable North-South bidding, was evidence that East, not West, had guards in every suit. East scarcely would have doubled six clubs after North had doubled one spade if he had had to fear solid clubs in South's hand and possibly solid spades in North's.

Declarer's analysis rewarded him well. After winning with the spade ace, he led a third round of the suit and ruffed away East's king. Now, forced to stake everything on a 2-2 trump break, South cashed the ace and led to the jack. When both defenders followed, dummy's good spades could be cashed, and the slam was home.

If West had not bid a spade, South's best chance would have been to take two finesses in the suit.
