LORD SALISBURY'S VIEWS

It is gratifying to the credit of Lord Salisbury that the Empire of which he is chief has so long been preserved from the danger of war. A single false step on his part might, almost at any time within the last two years, have precipitated the great encounter of which all men of peace and good will hardly dare to think.

You are aware, in the discussion had with the United States on behalf of their friends in Venezuela, our question has not been whether there should be arbitration but whether arbitration should have an unrestricted application, and we have always claimed that those who, apart from historic right, had the right which attaches to established settlements, should be excluded from the arbitration.

The practical sagacity of Lord Salisbury is well set forth in these words; and the people of Canada have cause to thank God for the good understanding between our Mother Country and our cousins over the border which they imply.

Concerning the Armenian question, Lord Salisbury said that he believed that the people of Great Britain are now virtually unanimous against isolated action, than which a worse course could not be adopted to benefit the Armenians.

It is announced from Washington that the arbitration of the Venezuelan dispute is a settled fact. All arrangements have been completed and all details of the arbitration treaty between the United States and Great Britain arranged.

Peru has sent an agent to England who will negotiate for the supply of artillery batteries and machine guns and the latest improvements in small arms.

The Ontario Government has ordered the slaughter of about one thousand hogs in the vicinity of Wallaceburg owing to the prevalence of hog cholera.

A loom has been started at Seattle looking to the nomination of William Jennings Bryan, of Nebraska, as United States senator from the state of Washington.

The new Lord Mayor of London proposes to commemorate the Queen's long reign by raising £1,000,000, with which to fund the London public hospitals from debt.

The late Miss Mary Alexander, of Londonderry, has left legacies for Irish Presbyterian purposes amounting to £7,500, besides other large sums for charitable purposes.

The winter residence and valuable library of Miss Octavia French (Octave Thauet), located at Elmwood, Kan., was destroyed by fire on Sunday night.
