"It certainly is time the dump was moved", said Councillor George Key at a special town council meeting here last night when the dump problem was discussed. "Councillors (Eric) Johnston and (Ernest) Morrison are to be congratulated for bringing negotiations together", Key said.

Mr. Gallant, licensee of the new dump agrees to (among other things) the following according to the written agreement among the three parties: permit all ratepayers and residents of St. Eleanors to dump their garbage for disposal during the regular business hours of the dump without charge; citizens of Summerside are allowed to haul garbage to St. Eleanors, St. Eleanors agrees among other items, to allow the licensee to enter into agreements with other municipal corporations or other bodies or private individuals to use the dumping area provided that this agreement is complied with.

NEW YORK (AP) — Boog Powell and rookie Curt Blefary cracked a three-run third inning homer Friday, triggering Baltimore to a 10-4 victory over the New York Yankees while the Orioles' Jerry Adair continued to his string of field records.

Adair, who has not made an error since July 21, 1964, handled nine chances, pushing his string to 417 without error and breaking Bobby Doerr's American League record of 414. The late Ken Hubbs of the Chicago Cubs holds the major league record of 418.

Adair also extended his own major league record of consecutive errorless games to 83.

W02 A.S. Clarkin, 54 Was Two-War Veteran

A veteran of two wars and with 25 years of active Army duty as a record, W02 Alan Stephen Clarkin, a native of this city, died suddenly at Camp Borden Hospital on Tuesday. He was 54.

He was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. P.W. Clarkin of this city, and received his education at Queen Square School, Prince of Wales College and in commercial schools. Long interested in service life, he had joined the local signals unit of the militia while still a boy and on the outbreak of the Second World War he 'went active' in 1939.

He returned to Canada in 1945 and for a time was stationed in Halifax before going to Ontario for the first of his four postings to Camp Borden in 1947. He served in the Korean war and on his return to Canada in 1952 was stationed briefly at Camp Borden before being posted to Germany for three years. He later served in Gagetown for three years and in Halifax two years before returning to Camp Borden in 1962 where he was School of Infantry RQMS at the time of his death.

He is survived by his wife, the former Lois Brady, RN, of this city, and four children: Terry Lynn 11; Deborah Carol 9; Stephen George 4 and Patricia Gail

The body arrived here Thursday evening accompanied by Lieut. A. Ricketts, Camp Borden, while also coming to Charlottetown for the funeral services was Rev. E. Cremona, Roman Catholic Chaplain, Halifax.

The funeral will be held from the Hennessey Funeral Home at 11.15 this morning to St. Dunstan's Basilica with interment in the Catholic Cemetery.

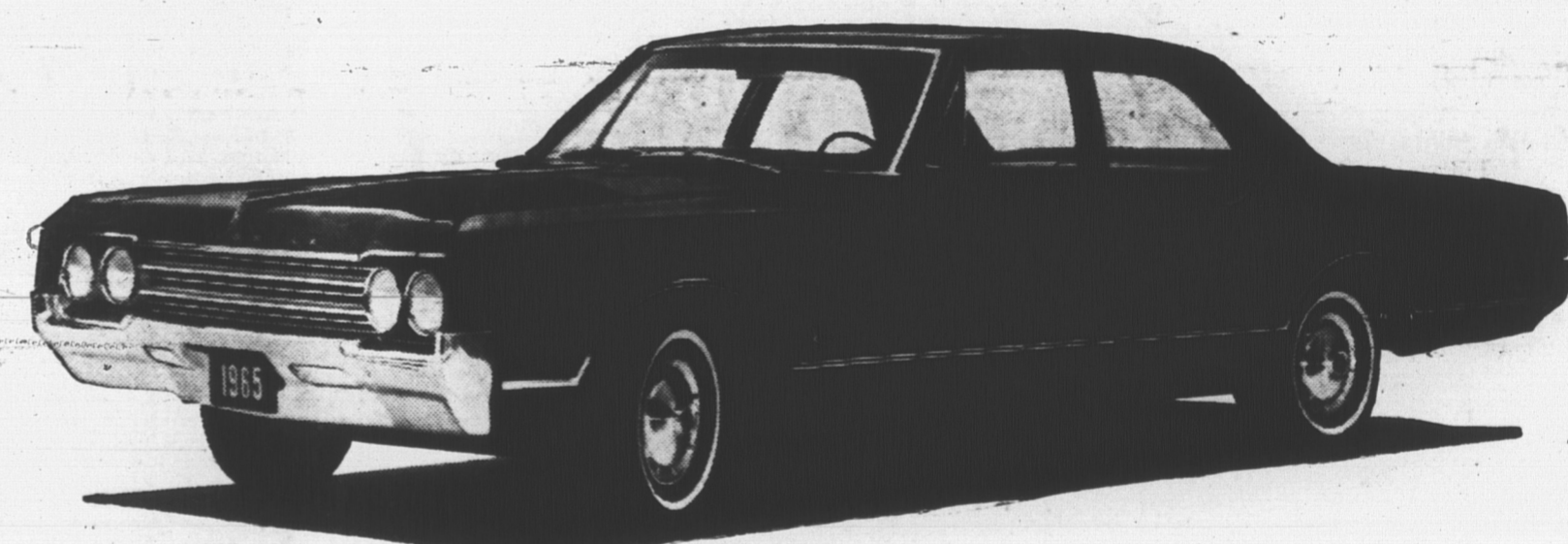
