Morell Clinic Has 120 Quota

Sponsored by the Morell Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion, with James Blackland as the chairman, the annual Red Cross blood donor clinic is to be held at the Legion Home in Morell on Wednesday afternoon, August 19, between 2 and 4 p.m., according to John D. Maclean, president of the Morell Legion.

Mr. Blackland has an energetic committee of local members working with him to insure an attendance of at least 120 donors at this two-hour clinic.

Last year's results at the Morell clinic were rather disappointing, when only 97 of the expected 120 donors turned up at the clinic, and the committee is making every effort to "top" its quota this year.

Wednesday's evening clinic will take place at St. Mary's Hall in Souris from 8 to 10 o'clock. This clinic, too, is being sponsored by the local branch of the Royal Canadian Legion with Marcus A. Money again as the chairman.

Souris has a quota of 150 donors to reach during this two-hour session which last year produced 181 donors. This splendid response is brought to the attention of the Morell Legion, as the chairman's objective is to exceed last year's percentage.
