**NO CHINESE PATENT OFFICE.**—There is no patent office in China, and no treaty with Canada regarding copyrights, trade marks and patents; therefore there is nothing to prevent Canadian books being reprinted, Canadian trade marks copied and Canadian patent goods reproduced by the Chinese themselves, though if the infringer were a Canadian, the case would be tried and decided by the Canadian consul, according to the laws of Canada.

**THE LIQUOR TRAFFIC.**—Russia has practically a state monopoly of the liquor traffic. According to an exchange this reform which was instituted three years ago, by the minister of finance, M. de Witte, has proved a great moral and material benefit to the people. Drunkenness and crime have fallen off, savings bank deposits have increased and the government revenue is much greater than under the excise law.

**LECTURE AT WEST RIVER.**—A very interesting lecture was delivered in Afton Hall, West River, on the 30th ult., by Rev. W. H. Warren. In his lecture Mr. Warren gave a grand description of the many magnificent scenes that met his eye while touring through England and Scotland. All the audience obtained a splendid view of these sights by means of a stereopticon. The lecture was much appreciated by the people of the place, as many of them are descendants of those who came from England and Scotland.

**THE SCHURMAN COMMISSION.**—The Filipino Junta at Hong Kong protests against the refusal of the United States to associate with the Philippines commission representatives of the national government, adding that the usefulness of the commission will, "necessarily be greatly limited by the exclusion of Filipinos." The members of the Junta continue:—"It is impossible for the commission, sitting only at Manila, unaided by the friendly co-operation of the national government, to reach a proper understanding of the actual condition of affairs in the Philippines, the unanimity of the aspirations of the people and their capability of self-government." Colonel Dewey's utterance in November Forum are too pronounced to inspire confidence.

**Enterprise in Nova Scotia**

It is reported that a meeting was held in the Board of Trade rooms in Halifax a few days ago in the interests of a large flour milling enterprise that it is being projected for that city. A number of merchants expressed sympathy with the scheme, and the intention to help by taking stock.

Mr. B. F. Pearson, who was one of the speakers, said the Dominion Coal Co. had given orders to raise every ton of coal that could be raised, and that coal was now coming up the slopes at the rate of 175,000 tons a month. Nearly a million of tons a year would soon be going into the United States market from Cape Breton, tariff or no tariff. Iron works would soon be established in Cape Breton, and he was in a position to say iron ship building could be done as cheaply here as anywhere.

J. A. Chipman said that S. M. Brookfield is now in England arranging for commencing iron ship building at this port.
