TORONTO (CP)—Base metals jumped almost 3% on the stock exchange Tuesday and closed only a point or two from an all-time index high. Western oils followed suit, adding two index points.

Hudson Bay paced senior base metals with a 1 1/2-point gain. Steep Rock was ahead a point. Labrador and Falconbridge had fractional advances. Consolidated Smelters lost 1/4. Granduc and Ormsby gained 30 cents among juniors while Consolidated Suburby was up 20 cents. Belcher lost 20 cents.

McIntyre added a point in golds and Lake Shore 30 cents. Consolidated Discovery was ahead 25 cents. Lamaque lost 25 cents. Consolidated Denison gained 20 cents in uranium.

Bailey-Selburn featured western oils, climbing 1 1/2 points. Central Explorers was ahead 65 cents. Canadian Pipelines was off 20 cents.

N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—Heavy trading and wide gains by oils, ably seconded by aluminum, sparked buoyancy among a variety of selected issues in the stock market Tuesday.

Brokers said the general inflationary outlook now that the steel strike is in its 17th day, combined with some good corporate reports was the main influence behind the rise.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 20 cents to \$188.50 with the industrials up 50 cents, the rails down 10 cents and the utilities unchanged.

Steels were generally off fractions as industry leaders huddled secretly to review the strike situation. Both U.S. Steel and Bethlehem lost 1/4.

Rails showed a variety of fractional gains and losses. Motors were narrowly mixed.

Aluminum Ltd. led Canadian issues on the New York exchange with a jump of 3%. McIntyre was up one point and Distillers-Seagram and Dome Mines both increased 1/4. Granby Mining slipped 1/4.

On the American exchange Fargo Oil went ahead 1-16. Bradford Tractor, Canadian Marconi and Shawinigan all dropped fractions.

Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP) — Industrial prices were mixed in a generally narrow range Tuesday at the close of moderate trading on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges. A few issues moved over a point in both directions.

Aluminum jumped three points while others were steady to fractionally lower in the base metals. Refining oils were a firm spot during most of the session but weakened near the close as B.A. slipped 1/4 and Canadian was unchanged. Trans Mountain lost a point in the pipelines.

Utilities were mixed with Shawinigan down 1/4 and Bell Telephone ahead 1/4. In the papers, *Le Journal* jumped 2 1/2 as Howard Smith lost a point. Beverages eased with *Le Journal* up 1/4. Banks were strong as Banque Canadienne Nationale climbed 1%.

Mines and western oils moved firmly forward as gains outnumbered declines almost two-one. Belchemise, El Fen Rey and Del Rio moved up in a 20 cent range. Bailey-Selburn gained 1% in senior issues. Montargy and Joliet Quebec lost in a 10 cent range.

The stock exchange's closing averages show banks up 0.47 at 57.7, utilities up 0.1 at 143.4, industrials up 2.3 at 321.4, combined up 1.6 at 268.2, papers up 4.77 at 3.03 at 98.98.
