

City Robs Rural Schools Of Teachers, Suggestion

Mr. Malcolm MacKenzie, deputy minister and director of education for Prince Edward Island, said Wednesday that Charlottetown was robbing the country schools of a great number of teachers, and urged the Island capital to make an effort to contribute more recruits to the teaching profession.

Introduced by Logan MacAulay and seconded by Mr. Duffy, Mr. MacKenzie was guest speaker at a meeting of the Rochford Square home and school association.

Held in the school hall the meeting was chaired by the association president, Mrs. Eugene Cullen.

Heard in addition to Mr. MacKenzie, who spoke chiefly on the proposal for larger school administrative units, were Mr. Kenneth A. Parker, superintendent of city schools, and Jack Duffy, membership convener.

While admitting that the citizens were "getting excellent value for their money", Mr. Parker asserted that in Charlottetown, a lesser portion of the taxpayer's dollar was devoted to education than obtained in any

other city in the Maritime Provinces.

Mr. Duffy reported that to date 72 families had joined the Association. For having the greatest number of parents present a pennant was awarded to the class taught by Mrs. Fred Hynes.

Chief item of entertainment was a program of choral reading provided by the pupils of Grades Four and Five.

The meeting, which opened with "O Canada", closed with "The Queen". Refreshments were served by a committee headed by Mrs. J. Doyle.

Worthy's Corner Is Reported Sold, Buyer Not Announced

Long known to city residents as "Worthy's Corner", the property, along with adjoining buildings, is reportedly on its way to new ownership.

Located on the corner of Euston street and Elm Avenue, the building houses a grocery store and several apartments.

Another smaller building on Euston Street is occupied by a furniture repair while other building said involved are on Elm Avenue and Chestnut St.

Lease termination notices have been received by tenants in the buildings concerned. This development came as responsible reports were circulating that arrangements are completed for sale of the properties involved, with the expectation they will be completed before the end of March.

The largest portion of the whole block is the estate of the late L. C. Worthy on the corner of Euston and Elm Avenue. This contains the longtime grocery business known as Cudmore's Grocery, along with several apartments in the same building.

OTHER BUILDINGS

Also on Euston Street is a smaller building used as a furniture repair shop. On Elm Avenue are the White Apartments and the Hennessy building. There are two buildings on Chestnut street, one owned by the Worthy Estate and the other by Peter Toole.

There is an 87 foot frontage on Euston Street, 78 feet on Elm Avenue and 66 feet on Chestnut.

The only surviving member of the Worthy family, Miss Lelia Worthy is presently on a visit to Europe. The estate is being administered by a trust company.

MOVES RUMORED

As developments involving Worthy's Corner became known today, rumors were circulating in Charlottetown that three large chain stores are actively studying locating or relocating in the city.

One is a major organization in the retail food trade and the others operate on a national basis in the variety store and appliance and furniture store fields.

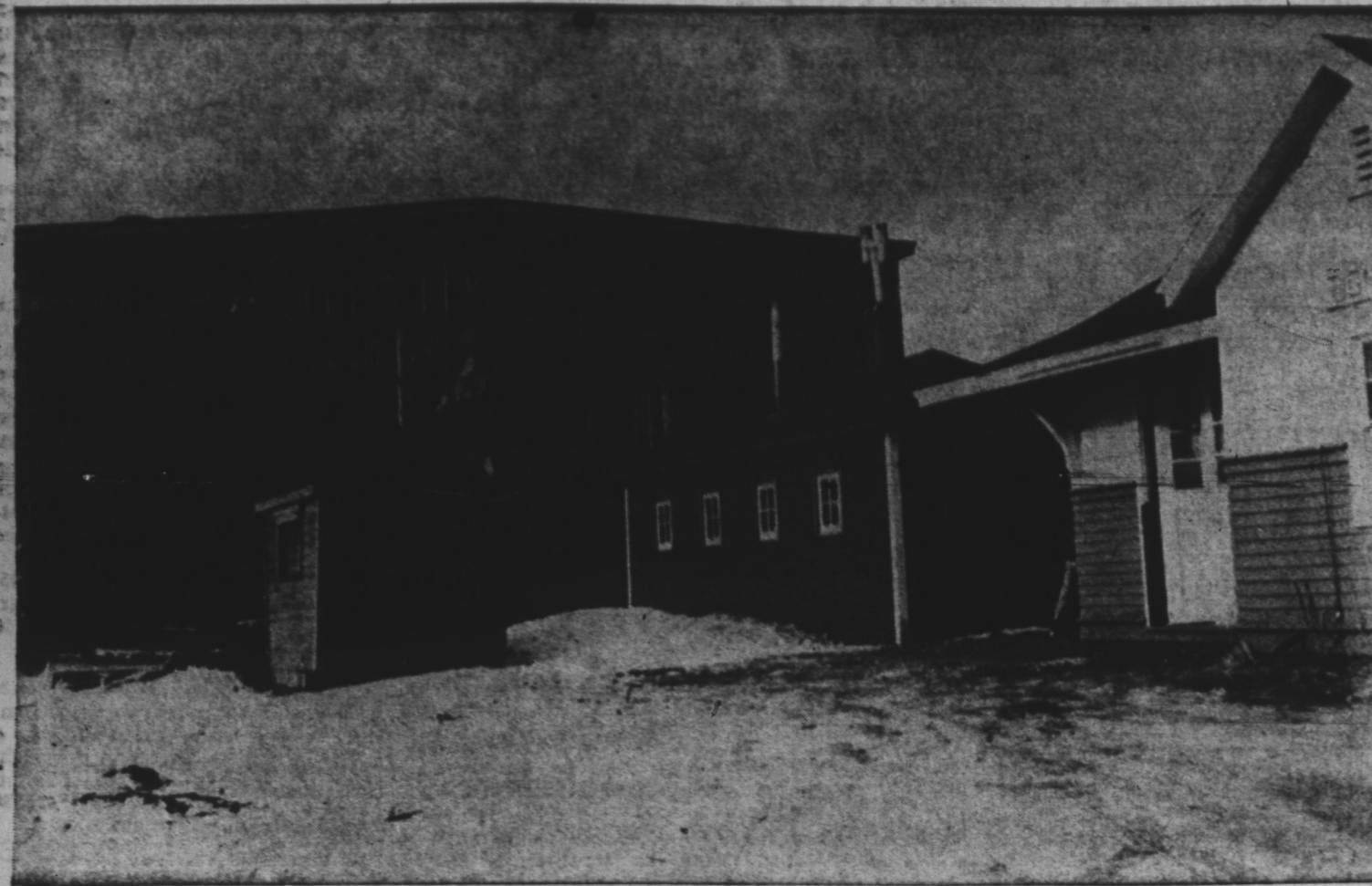
