Special Dispatch to the Examiner. LONDON, April 11. Parnell will go to Paris to-day. DUBLIN, April 11. Parnell's release was not at first understood to be on parole, and telegrams were sent to all parts of Ireland announcing the release was unconditional. The result was that the rejoicing was general. When the true state of affairs became known, bitter disappointment prevailed. A strong feeling sprang up in several places, giving rise to apprehensions among the public authorities. LONDON, April 11. The "Daily News" says a rumor finds favor in Dublin that Earl Cowper, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, is about to resign, and says it may be taken as proof that in the opinion of well-informed persons, some further steps, if not some change of policy, must be made, if order is to be re-established. The Standard's Madrid despatch says King Alfonso is much concerned over the disturbed state of Catalonia, and has expressed his desire that Catalonians be conciliated, even if some concessions must be made to them. VIENNA, April 11. Frosty weather continues. Snow and hail are damaging vegetation. ST. PETERSBURG, April 11. On the 6th, the Station Master at Moscow was arrested for supposed implication in the conspiracy against the Czar. CHICAGO, April 10. Mrs. Francis M.
